Under this program, Variety grants wheelchairs, standing frames, walkers, customised tricycles, communication aids and computers, wheelchair vehicle modifications, 12 and 24 seat Sunshine Coaches and Liberty Wheelchair Swings.

The Variety Future Kids program is the gift of education, achievement, experiences and play. Under this program, Variety grants children with social or distance disadvantage or disabilities scholarships to fulfill their academic, sports, music or arts potential by granting specialised equipment, tuition and coaching and other practical support, as well as fun outings and experiences.



The Variety Caring for Kids program is the gift of support, survival and recovery. Under this program Variety grants children's intensive care medical equipment and emergency transport equipment to children's medical facilities and transport services. The Variety Vision for Life high definition tele-medicine network is a major part of the Caring for Kids program.

# CCUUSE



HAVING BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH CEREBRAL PALSY AND ATHETOID presentation at birth, Siobhan was left severely physically disabled, with tightness of her arm and leg muscles as well as involuntary movement of her limbs.

Eleven year old Siobhan is now much more independent and can enjoy many of her favourite activities with her family and friends, thanks to Variety - the Children's Charity which funded a new standing frame.

Siobhan's mother, Caroline explains, "Ever since receiving the new standing frame, Siobhan is now able to be involved in her favourite activities and gain independence. In particular she loves spending time cooking while standing in the frame. As a huge MasterChef fan, cooking is one of Siobhan's favourite activities and the tray table on the frame allows her to easily whip up some foodie creations, including her favourite, pizza." Siobhan is also able to now spend quality time with her eight year old sister, Shannon. The pair can often be found side by side cooking together. The independence Siobhan has gained from the frame has made her so much more confident and happier."

"As Christian was so severely disabled, just feeding him was a challenge as I would have to physically lift him and feed him at the same time as he couldn't sit in a normal high chair. His brother and sister also found it hard to play with him as he couldn't sit on the floor on his own. Really every aspect of interacting with Christian was made difficult because of his physical constraints. Things became so much easier once we were given the hi-lo chair, giving him newfound mobility. It rises and lowers for feedings and he can now play with his siblings at their level. In turn, this has assisted him in developing his communication and social skills, enabling him to focus on eye gaze, facial gestures and interaction, rather than using all of his energy to try to sit up. As the chair tilts, he can even now nap comfortably". Among his favourite activities to participate in thanks to being able to have his height and eye level changed to suit include watching cartoons with his siblings and having them read to him as well as engaging in role play around the home.

> While the hi-lo chair provided by Variety cost \$9505, it has made a world of difference to Christian and his family which can't be measured in dollars. The hi-lo chair has allowed Christian to participate in age appropriate activities, mealtimes with his family at the kitchen table and also interact face to face with his peers and siblings."

"Prior to receiving the glove sleeve, Alex wasn't able to do much with his right hand, he couldn't even hold his own utensils when he ate. He was reliant on me for almost all aspects of the everyday things that require basic gross motor skills, such as holding and picking up things. Since he received the glove sleeve, Alex has now been able to use his hand which has empowered him to be able to care for himself more independently and participate more fully in all aspects of his daily life. His new found independence has been reflected in Alex's new found confidence, particularly at school where he can now participate in sports and food classes. The glove also means that Alex won't have to endure surgery to his hand."

"Morgan has been in a wheelchair all his young life, anytime we had to travel anywhere we had to physically pick him up and place him in an infant car seat. As he has grown, this has become an enormous and tiring effort. I've injured my back and my wife, Jennie is unable to lift him anymore now as he weighs 20kg. As a result, Morgan has had limited time out of the home and has not been able to participate in outings with his friends and family. However, now with Variety's help, our car has been modified for wheelchair access which has made a huge difference to our lives. Our entire family including Morgan's brothers, five year old Charlie and 10 year old Jack are now able to enjoy occasions out together including going to the park and visiting other friends and family without Morgan having to miss out."

"As Aaron is so severely disabled, just to get him in and out of the car to go out was a challenge which grew as he did. My wife and I would have to carry him from the house and as he got older and heavier, it became much harder until Variety helped us acquire a lift for the car, which enables us to wheel Aaron onto the lift at ground level which then lifts him straight into the vehicle. We can now enjoy many more family outings and trips and delight in having quality time together as a family and seeing Aaron's face light up as we drive around."

> "Access to the community is critical to the learning of our children and that will be made much easier with our new Sunshine Coach, which would not have been be possible without the fundraising efforts of our school community and Variety. The Lakeside School's coach is the 1,193rd Sunshine Coach granted throughout Australia. Variety strives to provide wonderful experiences for as many children as possible."

# **Oblity**

"Maddisan's condition severely affects her mobility and her ability to engage in the normal daily activities of a five year old. She had an old wheelchair on loan which wasn't in good condition and as it had been designed for another child, it didn't suit Maddisan's postural needs. However, with the new wheelchair Maddisan has been able to learn to separate herself from us and become more independent, as it has an adjustable tray table so Maddisan can feed herself, play with her toys and do arts and crafts. She is also much safer in this new wheelchair and is better supported to allow for changes in posture as the wheelchair tilts which also helps better manage her seizures. The wheelchair has made such a drastically positive difference to Maddisan, as she is now able to be more like a normal five year old. We are so thrilled that she is safe in the chair, thanks to the fully supportive seating system and the adjustable tray table which allows her to participate in feeding times and playing with her siblings."





### VARIETY - THE CHILDREN'S CHARITY RECOGNISES THE HUGE DEMANDS,

both emotional and financial, that caring for a child with special needs can make. Variety can't remove that burden but we do make life easier for families by providing vital equipment to enable communication, independence, mobility, self-esteem and confidence.

Variety's Freedom program encompasses manual and electric wheelchairs, walking frames, Hi-Lo Chairs, special tricycles, communication computers, iPads and aids, suction human hair suction wigs for kids with alopecia, autism companion dogs, vehicle modifications for wheel-chairs, bath and shower chairs, sleep positioning systems, muscle strengthening equipment and wheelchair hoists to name a few.

Unlike most organisations, who focus on a single problem or narrow area, Variety grants essential equipment to families of children living with one, or multiple of, many

physical and intellectual conditions. Sometimes, it's the small things that make a really big difference. A specially adapted car seat costing just a few hundred dollars may mean the family of a child with special needs can finally go on trips together or an iPad with special communications software that allows an autistic child to communicate with their family, removing frustration for all and improving quality of life. "Previously John would try to communicate by holding up pictures or photos of what he was trying to convey, which over time became more difficult and frustrating as he struggled to be understood. In just a few short months, the iPad and communication device has significantly aided in his speech development, making life so much easier. It has made such a positive difference to John both with his speech and behaviorally as well. To start he could only manage a few words but is now beginning for speak in sentences. He is infinitely happier also as he no longer gets frustrated and upset by not being able to communicate with us and every day his speech is progressing further."

Variety Sunshine Coaches have allowed generations of young Australians to experience and explore, to be curious, to bond with parents, teachers and carers and to feed their minds and fire their imaginations.

Many coaches have special modifications for wheelchair access and carry. For the schools and community groups who use them, Sunshine Coaches mean much easier provision of a whole range of activities, including sports, educational and cultural visits, community and life skills projects.

Each Sunshine coach represents a team fundraising effort between the school or organisation, Variety – the Children's Charity and corporate or individual sponsors. Sunshine coaches are a very popular and far reaching way for generous donors to give something back to their local community. "An integral part of the educational experience for our students is accessing local community places and events. a virtual hospital that allows the very best clinicians and specialist doctors to save the life of a critically injured or ill child via a state of the art high definition tele-medicine network imagine Variety Vision for Life.

Variety Vision for Life gives specialist doctors the ability to see a premature baby, sick or injured child in real time, allowing very accurate assessment, diagnosis and decisions on whether to treat the baby or child locally or transport them by air or road to another specialist hospital.

Being able to see a child not only provides a possibly lifesaving

diagnosis and treatment plan, it also provides first class help when it is needed most and saves money and family disruption by helping prevent unnecessary road or air retrieval transport.

Variety Caring for Kids program is the gift of survival and recovery by granting vital medical equipment to individual children, children's hospital intensive care units and children's emergency transport services.

Equipment granted includes life support systems, neonatal monitors, humidicribs, prosthetic limbs, high intensity illumination systems for intensive care units carrying out delicate surgery and Variety Vision for Life tele-medicine systems to name a few.







"Sophie was born with a left transcarpal upper limb deficiency. Use of the myoelectric prosthesis has improved the overall quality of life by supporting development of social skills and peer relationships through participation in two handed gross motor and fine motor activities as well as supporting the development of independence in age appropriate activities of daily living. Our heartfelt thanks to Variety for funding Sophie's myoelectric prosthesis, we couldn't have done it without you." "Georgia had kidney failure from birth so we knew that she would have to have a transplant at some stage, even so, it was difficult to see her on so much medication in the isolation room. She is now back at school and full of energy, thanks to much needed community support from Variety - the Children's Charity. Without Variety's support, the hospital could not offer such world class award winning care for its precious young patients."

Mitchell was born in 1993 with Cerebral Palsy. As a child he showed a natural talent for athletics. Regarded a very worthy recipient of financial support through the Variety Scholarship Program, Mitchell has continued to achieve wonderful results in his chosen field of athletics.

Accomplishments include competing at the Oceania Paralympics, breaking the Australian under 20's record, a wonderful achievement considering it was his first competition at an open age. Mitchell has also placed 1st in the 16 to 19 year section of the NSW All schools Cross Country Championships and participated in the Australian's with Disabilities Underage Championships.

Mitchell's family are immensely grateful to Variety for the opportunities the Scholarship has afforded Mitchell. The financial support through the Program has facilitated access to coaches, the cost of travelling to events and competitions, training costs, the purchase of home gymnasium equipment to improve strength, plus shoes and spikes.

The rewards of being a Variety Scholarship recipient have been immeasurable. Without funding from Variety, Mitchell believes it would have been near impossible for him to have achieved all that he has; in both athletics and self confidence.





# future kids program

VARIETY'S FUTURE KIDS PROGRAM WORKS HARD

to help children and young people feel empowered and liberated to do and be what they want to be. Future Kids provides opportunities for children who are disadvantaged or have special needs to learn more about the world and more about themselves, in the process raising their aspirations and prospects for the future.

Future Kids enables children with intellectual or physical disabilities to positively transform their communication, learning ability and academic performance.

Fostering talent in sports, arts, drama, music and academia for children who are isolated, disadvantaged or have special needs is an important part of the Future kids umbrella. The Scholarship program provides each child up to \$5,000 per year and may cover tuition fees, equipment costs, personal development, travel and accommodation.

At a grassroots level, Variety's Future Kids program allows volunteers and corporate supporters to provide experiences and fun under the variety@work program. These include outings, disco's, Christmas parties, wheelchair ice skating, ten pin bowling and visits to attractions. It's already proving a big year for 14-year-old Luke who is one of Australia's most promising young cricketing talents. The youngster was awarded Fairfield RSL Club's Junior Cricket Champion of the Year at the end of season awards. The award recognised his achievements playing representative junior club cricket for Fairfield RSL under 14s and his efforts as the club's leading junior player across the under nine to under 17 teams, amassing 640 points for the season.

"Luke's success to date would not have been possible without the support of Variety – the Children's Charity as they made Luke part of their scholarship program. They've helped provide coaching and sporting equipment and also have helped with a contribution towards a trip to Darwin with his school team, which gives him valuable away-from-home sporting experience", said Luke's mother Lisa.

For a young person with a disability, sport is so much more than just a game. It is a priceless opportunity to make new friends and build selfesteem in a supportive community of peers. For a growing child with complex and constantly changing needs, a comfortable wheelchair that fits both their body and their lifestyle can genuinely transform their life, but these are expensive pieces of equipment.

Keegan is an amazing young man who was born with Arthrogryposis and uses a wheelchair to fully function day to day and maintain his independence. Keegan is a recipient of a Variety scholarship which enables him to purchase much needed equipment for wheelchair tennis and basketball.

Assuming a tax rate of 32.5%, a \$10 donation each week only costs you \$7.75 after the immediate tax deduction, however, Variety receives the full \$10.00.

Outside of work, Regular Giving is also a simple and effective way to help Variety purchase equipment for children who are sick, disadvantaged or have special needs, transforming their lives and those of their families. Regular donors give an amount of their choice each month, claiming a tax deduction for those donations.

# Thanks to a special grant from Variety, six year old

Evan can now enjoy the outdoors with his siblings and friends! Diagnosed with cerebral palsy and developmental delay, Evan is dependent on his family for all self care and mobility and uses a specialised wheelchair and custom insert to

> support his mobility and postural needs. Because standard bicycles do not provide the support he requires, Variety granted Evan a modified bike, giving him the opportunity to engage in age appropriate play opportunities that would otherwise not be available to him, enabling him to develop his motor and social skills and helping build wonderful, long lasting memories at the same time.

# tasmania

Timsbury School, located in the Hobart suburb of Moonah, caters for students with special needs from year 7 to 10 with significant intellectual and learning difficulties. This small learning community has limited resources at their disposal yet are committed to developing social and life skills that will enable their pupils to perform and thrive to the best of their ability within the greater community.

"The new Sunshine Coach was specially modified to suit our school and student needs." School Principal Nick Donnelly went on to say "The new bus will provide the school with greater capacity to provide educational and social experiences for our students. This bus is equipped with a hoist and other safety features which will ensure that all students of Timsbury School will be able to attend events, access the community and participate in a more diverse learning beyond the school in an inclusive, nondiscrimatory environment."

# Everyone has their favourite chair in their favourite spot, and now

Everyone has their favourite chair in their favourite spot, and now Jye is no different!

A small group of supporters gathered at the Variety NT office to meet Jye, his mum Pauline and little sister Tia, and to present Jye with his new Pediatric Club Chair.

Jye was spending most of his day in his wheelchair, but now he can watch TV and do other activities in his chair. Jye's Pediatric Club Chair has custom-molded cushions to support him, and adjustable and removable arm rests, foot rests and tray table, which will enable the chair to `grow' with him.

Jye's chair also reclines so he can watch his favourite dvds in extra comfort.

Kai is a bright motivated 6 year old who has cerebral palsy, severe haemophilia and complex communication needs.

Due to his disability Kai has an extremely weak trunk and difficulty functionally using his right side. Kai requires assistance with most of his movements and with all aspects of daily living.

Kai is off to Primary School next year and it is important that among a number of items of equipment he will require is a dynamic standing frame.

This standing frame will enable Kai to stand unsupported and will benefit the development of his muscles, lower bone density, improve his upright blood pressure and enable him to participate in activities in standing so he is the same height as his peers.



# At 18 months of age, Samual was diagnosed with spinal

muscular atrophy and as a result his muscles degenerate, making him slowly lose the use of them. Due to his condition, Samuel has become wheelchair dependent and transporting him is an enormous task for his family.

Five-year-old Samuel is now about to get out and about with his family, thanks to Variety – the Children's Charity which funded modifications to the family car to allow wheelchair access.

Samuel's mother, Andrea explains, "Samuel is only able to walk short distances in his walker and gets tired very quickly, so we rely on the wheelchair as his primary mode of transportation. Prior to our car modifications, getting him in and out of our vehicle was a challenge. As a result Samuel had limited time out of the home and had not been able to participate in outings with his friends or even go out as a family, as the task of transporting him was too difficult. Now with Variety's help, our car has been modified for wheelchair access which has made a huge difference to our lives. We are able to go to the beach and park and enjoy outings as a family. It is particularly nice for Samuel's seven-year-old brother, Thomas to be able to play with Samuel at the park as these sorts of outings weren't really possible before."



10-year-old Jazmin suffers from a Arthrogryposis, which affects 1 in 17,000 births in Australia and means she can only walk independently over short distances, so she spends the majority of her life in a wheelchair. The condition limits the range of motion in the body's joints such as in hands, wrists, elbows, shoulders, hips, feet and knees.

Having endured many medical procedures in her short 10 years of life including surgeries that have left her spine permanently fused and unable to grow, Jazmin has a hard road in front of her. But Variety – the Children's Charity has bought hope to Jazmin and her family in the form of chocolate brown eyes and a wagging tail – an assistance dog!

Assistance dogs are highly trained Labradors or golden retrievers able to undertake everyday tasks such as opening doors, pressing the button to cross the road and retrieving dropped items.

Jazmin's mother Alicia says the assistance dog will be an enormous help and a great companion for her daughter. "An assistance dog would help her complete simple tasks most people take for granted, like picking things up from the ground or getting up after a fall giving her more independence and confidence"

# Nathen, 15, was struck down with a virus when he was

8 years old that left him paralysed from the waist down. Nathen has been a recipient of the Variety Scholarships Program since 2010 which is helping him achieve his dream to represent Australia at the 2012 London Paralympics, by providing equipment such as racing frames, gloves, tyres and racing wheels.

Nathen is currently ranked No 1 for under 18's in the world for the 200m 400m 1500m 5000m and marathon. This year Nathen achieved an A qualification time (for the London Paralympics) while in Switzerland for the marathon and hopefully this will be enough to get him on the Australian team.

"Sport for Nathan has had so many benefits aside from the fitness and health aspects, his increasing confidence and independence has flowed through to all areas of his life," says Nathen's mum, Lisa.
