Rare Care Service

The Variety Rare Care Service helps families who have a child with a rare disease by providing a practical case management service. Thanks to your support, Variety was able to expand this service in 2017 to the Newcastle/Hunter region. This meant 27 families in NSW were able to benefit from this service, including Jordan and Logan who both have a rare intestinal genetic condition and are connected to IV pumps up to 18 hours each day.

Murruunyandahl

Murruunyandahl has been described by his coach as an outstanding talent with a great future ahead of him. Overcoming disadvantage, he regularly trains in both hapkido and jiu jitsu and has competed at national and state level. His next goal is to make it to black belt and eventually make a career out of the sport. He was awarded a Variety Heart Scholarship this year which he will use to cover his training fees and take part in a Hapkido camp.





Arianna

Arianna is six and loves singing, dancing and going to school. She has Cerebral Palsy, so relies on a wheelchair to get around. To help her stand and prevent further medical problems that come with always sitting, she needed a specialised walking frame. Variety's generous supporters made this possible and she received her frame this year. Her mum said 'She absolutely loves being so up right and at almost eye level with everyone, I love seeing Arianna so happy and comfortable.'

Activate Inclusion Sports Days

Launched this year are our new Activate Inclusion Sports Days. In partnership with Sports NSW we hold these Sports Days around NSW for kids with disabilities so they have a chance to try different sports, some of them for the first time. Hundreds of kids have had the chance to try everything from tennis to judo and rugby. The program is set to continue throughout 2018 with days planned all around the state.





Variety Musical Picnics

Another new Kids' Event this year are the Variety Musical Picnics. Held in school holidays, kids of all abilities are invited along for a morning of fun musical workshops. Designed so all kids can get involved, families are excited to not only have something to do with their kids, but to meet other parents and get their kids involved in a new experience. So far only held in Sydney and Newcastle, your support means Variety will be able to expand these picnics to more areas in the future.

Gwabegar Public School

Last year we granted 13 Sunshine Coaches to schools around NSW and the ACT. This included one to Gwabegar Public School which is in the middle of the Pilliga Forest and has eight amazing young students. The coach will be used to take the kids to Dubbo, Canberra and Sydney for excursions as well as reduce the burden on some of the parents who are currently travelling more than 50km each way to get the kids to and from school.





Goldie

Goldie was given the gift of mobility by Variety this year. She has Retts Syndrome, which is a lifelong condition that means she can't walk or talk. Her parents and big brothers do everything for her and as Goldie gets older it gets harder to get her around. Her family applied for a new wheelchair and car conversion from Variety, which has changed their lives for the better. Goldie can now go everywhere with her family, not missing out on trips to the park or watching her brothers play footy.

Carenne School

Carenne School cares for kids with a range of disabilities, providing quality education and support. Refurbishing the gym, the school needed some sensory equipment and Variety was able to grant fibre optics for the kids to use. The principal said "The new equipment will bring a lot of joy to our students, as well as help to develop their fine motor skills and increase their visual awareness, particularly for our students with vision impairments."

Hair with Heart

Variety was inundated with ponytails this year through Hair with Heart. Hair donations are sold and made into wigs for those who have lost their hair due to a medical condition. Funds raised through the sale of the hair support our grants, services and programs. This year an incredible \$1,044,110 was raised.

Woolworths Supermarkets

The generosity of Woolies staff has continued this year with customer raffles, in store tokens, Fresh Community Fairs and the Woolworths Charity Ball for Variety. Brilliant support from Woolies at every level of the organisation helped raise more than \$2 million for Variety kids in local communities.

We held two Variety of Chef events in Sydney and Newcastle, with the Variety community coming out in force to support. Both nights saw guests enjoy a delicious dinner, fun live entertainment and dig deep to fund Vision for Life cameras in ambulances and a Sunshine Coach for Newcastle Junior School.

Volunteers

At Variety we have many active volunteers who work across everything from office tasks to events and helping our kids. Our volunteers are young and old, fit and not so fit, busy or with lots of time on their hands but the one thing in common is their passion to help kids enjoy themselves regardless of ability.

The Young Variety committee held a 10x10 event in June which saw 110 young professionals raise an amazing \$24,481. Funds raised went to our Just Like You program, musical workshops for kids and beach wheelchairs. The night was led by businesswoman and philanthropist Lucy Turnbull AO.

was built this year in North
Richmond. Franchises also got
involved in the 'Fab Slab' promotion
where a donation was made for every
slab poured in a month. These efforts
have seen this great partnership grow
to a new level, resulting in helping more
Aussie kids in need.

4WD Adventure

The much loved annual Variety 4WD Adventure continues to grow. This year taking Adventurers through the rugged terrain of Tasmania. There was plenty of fun along the way and the 62 Adventurers raised \$177,137 and granted much needed equipment to three schools along the way.

SKY News

The team at SKY News made a significant contribution to Variety in 2017 including airing the Freedom House on the Real Estate Channel, attending the Gala Ball, kids ice-skating, and the Kids Xmas Party. They have also aired other Variety stories, sharing our message far and wide with their audience.

Variety NSW Bash

The Variety NSW Bash raised over \$800,000 this year with more than 85 cars taking on the fun and iconic adventure through regional NSW. Supported by the Australian Hotels Association Hunter sub-branch, our Bashers also donated \$51,000 worth of equipment and resources to local schools and visited towns such as Gilgandra, Yass, Bathurst and Muswellbrook.

Variety Brydens Lawyers B to B Bash

In August our Bashers headed off from Belmore to Buffalo Creek for 11 days of fun and laughter. Visiting remote schools and enjoying street parties with the locals, great fun and some serious fundraising was enjoyed by all. An incredible \$1.8M was raised to help thousands of Aussie kids in need.

PKF has supported Variety of Chefs Newcastle for the past three years and this year also entered a team into Variety Spin 4 Kids and provided 20 volunteers for the Variety Newcastle Kids Xmas Party.
