Therapy Grant RARE CARE Policy Guidelines Individual NSW/ACT



Introduction

Variety NSW/ACT provides assistance towards the purchase of therapeutic interventions to assist children that have been diagnosed with a rare disease or condition up to the value of \$1500 over a 12 month period.

Eligibility

- Applicants must be Australian Citizens or Permanent Residents
- Applicants must live in NSW or ACT
- Applications can only be accepted for children aged 0 to 18 years
- Applicants must be medically diagnosed with a Rare Disease or Condition
- Previous recipients will not be considered for another a Therapy grant until 12 months after the date listed on their outcome letter
- Unsuccessful applicants may be eligible to reapply for a Therapy grant 12 months after the date listed on their outcome letter

What is a Rare Disease?

A rare disease is any disorder or condition that is life-threatening or chronically debilitating, which is also statistically rare.

For the purposes of the Therapy Grant Rare Care, rare conditions are defined as a rate of one in 2,500 or less. Variety uses ORPHANET (an internationally recognised list of rare diseases and conditions) as a primary resource for confirmation of diseases and conditions. www.orpha.net.com

Variety NSW/ACT recommends consulting with your NDIS planner, GP, Specialist, Therapist or Social/Support Worker before starting an application so they can best support you through the process. NDIS

Is your child part of the NDIS?

YES

As part of the application, you will be asked to identify why the item(s) you are requesting a grant for are not covered by the child's NDIS plan. Varying reasons may include but are not limited to:

- planning meeting has yet to occur
- o funds already allocated to other items
- was not supported by the NDIS (an explanation will need to be provided)

NO

Applications are welcome from children aged 0-18 years medically diagnosed with a chronic illness or disability that are <u>not</u> approved under the NDIS.

Therapy Grant requests

The Applicant can select one or more as part of their grant request up to the value of \$1500. These must be directly related to the child's diagnosis and supported by a GP & Allied Health Professional (please see 'Attachments/Evidence' below). The following will form the basis of the grant and if successful, cannot be amended after the approval date.

- Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Speech Therapy
- Hydrotherapy
- Counselling
- Psychology
- Psychotherapy
- Art Therapy
- Music Therapy

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Therapy Grant requests NOT eligible

The following will not be considered as part of the grant request

- Retrospective funding only items purchased <u>after</u> the approval date will be eligible to claim as part of the grant
- Lessons, classes, sessions or courses which are provided by someone other than a qualified medical professional

Application

- · Applications are open all year round
- Applications are made on behalf of the child by a Parent/Carer or another identified support person (Medical professional, caseworker, teacher etc.) aged 18 years and over
- Applicants will be expected to submit a truthful and factual application & attach relevant documentation as
 evidence, addressing but not limited to the following points:
 - o Name and contact details of applicant
 - o Details directly related to the child's diagnosis including Doctor's information
 - o Financial documents will need to be uploaded to the application related to household income

Applicants need to ensure the application addresses all criteria and addresses all the information required or risk the application process being delayed or in some cases, denied.

Attachments/Evidence

The following attachments must be included as part of the application.

1. A **GP or Pediatrician** on letterhead outlining the child's diagnosis/condition and the referral to the therapeutic intervention (i.e. OT, Physio etc.).

This document must be dated within 12 months at the time of submission

- 2. Household Income –A or B must be attached to the application.
 - a. Health Care Card (view example here)
 If one of the Parent/Carers has a health care card they need to attach a copy of the card. Variety only requires one parent to attach their card. The health care card must be in date and in the Parent/Carers name (not the child's).

OR

b. Income

For <u>each</u> Parent/Carer that selects option B, they must provide copies of the most recent documents related to

- Payslip if currently employed and/or
- o Centrelink Statement if currently receiving any benefits

Please keep in mind that the assessment process may take up to 6 weeks before you receive an outcome from Variety once you submit an application.

Post-Submission and Assessment

- Submissions are assessed by the Variety Kids Support Team
- Eligible submissions are presented to the Kids Support Committee for approval
- Kids Support Committee meetings are held once a month (except January)

Outcomes

Outcome letters are emailed to applicants approximately 4-6 weeks after their initial submission

Unsuccessful Applicants

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


- Reasons pertaining to unsuccessful applications are at the discretion of the Kids Support Committee
- Unsuccessful applicants may be eligible to reapply in 12 months from the date listed on the outcome letter

Successful Applicants

- Successful Applicants have 12 months from the date of approval on their outcome letter to use their grant
- No retrospective funding is eligible
- Successful applicants are directed to provide their outcome letter to the Therapist associated with their approved granted item
- The Therapist must provide a tax invoice to Variety NSW/ACT and within the approved amount
 (please note under this grant, Variety NSW/ACT will not provide money directly to applicants and/or
 parent/carers; money is paid directly to suppliers)
- It is the responsibility of the parent/carer to action all appropriate steps after receiving the outcome letter (as directed)
- Any unused and/or unspent funds will be forfeited after the expiry date of the grant
