546 kids and their families were helped with grants for practical support including educational supplies, mobility equipment and therapies.

6,277 kids in need experienced the joy of Variety events and play spaces including the Variety Kids Xmas Parties, and Variety Livvi's Place inclusive playground.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All vehicles must be 30 years old at start of the Bash or older and be non-performance modified with run on models restricted to four years younger. They must be roadworthy, registered and insured as prescribed by State laws. 2. All vehicles must be conventional two wheel drive vehicles with a maximum crew of four people. Motorcycles, buses, coaches, caravans, skateboards or wheelbarrows are not permitted. 3. Crew members must be a minimum of 18 years of age and hold a current driver's license. 4. All vehicles must carry on the front doors the Bash door panels on to which must be fixed the allocated Bash car number for that vehicle. All vehicles must place on their front windscreen the event sun strip decal featuring Variety and sponsor logos. The vehicle number must also be clearly visible using fluro numbers on the front (100mm) and rear (150mm) windscreens. Window numbers are supplied for new entrants. All cars must also display the event sponsor decals as supplied by the organiser. 5. All vehicles are required to attend a Checkpoint day prior to the start of the Bash. Any vehicles unable to attend Checkpoint need to obtain prior consent from the Regional Motoring Events Manager. 6. Everyone taking part in the Bash in any way must complete an indemnity agreement issued by Variety – the Children's Charity NSW/ACT. 7. All entrants in the Bash must have paid to Variety either personally or through donations the sum on the Entry Form by the specified dates and prior to the start of the event. 8. Any provisions fees or extra merchandise must be paid prior to the start of the event. 9. At all times all entrants must abide by the rules of the road as prescribed by State laws and statutes. 10. All entrants and crew must have a current Working with Children's Check (WWCC).





The History of The Bash

The Bash started in 1985 with businessman and philanthropist Dick Smith. He came up with the idea to take a few of his mates for a drive through the outback in old cars and raise money for charity at the same time. That first Bash saw entrants travel from Sydney -Bourke - Burketown in QLD.

It raised an incredible \$250,000 for Variety and since then has become a series of events held around Australia with a fundraising total of more than \$200 million!

Day 3 **Tuesday 19 May**

We have discovered a great little school just 30kms down the road so a refreshing drive this morning to the Pallamallawa Public School who have agreed to host our Bash breakfast. The 26 kids will enjoy the madness and mayhem you will bring to their tiny community. From here we go in search of an even more isolated community. It's back out on the black soil plains to the rural village of Rowena. It will be a Pre-School Day when we visit so the student numbers will explode to 30 for the day. From this great little spot we head even further west to the bustling mining town of Lightning Ridge. It is just a short afternoon here to give you all a chance to explore the hidden treasures this unique community has to offer. Our evening get together will be our Bushman's night at Lightning Ridge Outback Resort.

The Variety Bash is all about having fun and raising funds for kids in need. Each NSW Bash car needs to raise a minimum of \$4,000. This money is a donation and is fully tax deductible. We have a team on hand to help you fundraise - all you need to do is ask. The first \$500 of entry donation is required to secure your place in the event and is non-refundable. None of our Bashers go hungry and most meals are provided during the Bash, we will let you know your provisions cost before the event. Accommodation is up to each Basher to organise, we'll let you know some of the options in each great town we visit.



What is a Bash car?

Variety Bash cars come in all shapes and sizes and are a unique mix of fun and flashy. They need to be at least 30 vears old (there is a four year run on period if the model does not change within that time) but well-maintained to handle dirt roads. Bashers are encouraged to decorate their cars (and themselves). You can modify your car if it's to enhance the design for your theme i.e. The "Clampett's" car has Granny's rocking chair on top. All car decorations and modifications must be within the laws of the RMS. The transmission, engine and engine ancillaries must be as originally specified for the vehicle but you can modify brakes, suspension and fuel tanks for safety reasons. No improvements for speed or performance are allowed. If you have any car questions you can always give our office a call. Need a Bash car? We always know of Bash cars for sale and can steer you in the right direction.

Support Vehicles?

We care about our Bashers so we travel with volunteer mechanics, a medical team, tilt tray and baggage truck. The Variety Bash is all about fun and helping kids and our support vehicles are there to make sure you're safe. Car troubles? We will always get you to a town or mechanic.
