For half a century, Variety has worked tirelessly to provide children with access to mobility equipment, therapy, medical care, and educational opportunities. This would not have been possible without the generosity of our donors, fundraisers, and corporate partners.

I am deeply grateful for this enduring support and immensely proud of the difference it has made to generations of Australian families. From funding essential equipment to creating inclusive opportunities, our vision remains clear - to ensure every child can thrive, belong, and reach their full potential, regardless of disability or circumstance.

In April, Variety Australia celebrated these achievements with a reception at Government House, Sydney. Hosted by Her Excellency the Honourable Margaret Beazley AC KC, Governor of New South Wales, the event honoured the dedication and passion that have defined Variety's story.

Against this backdrop, Variety was proud to be recognised at the Third Sector Awards for our Variety Flying Start Paediatric Service - a program that delivers critical assessments and diagnoses for children across Western NSW who are living with a range of disabilities, including ADHD and autism. The award shines a light on the ongoing inequity faced by families in remote and regional areas. It belongs to every partner, supporter, team member, and family who helps make this essential work possible.

I'm continually inspired by how far our community will go to make a difference - from spending hours on a spin bike, days in a Bash car, or helping bring festive joy at our Variety Xmas parties. The spirit of compassion and commitment truly defines who we are.

One of my personal highlights has been seeing early growth from the implementation of new fundraising initiatives as we seek to broaden Variety's fundraising channels. We have established the right conditions and acquired the necessary skills to nurture new fundraising opportunities to continue our mission of empowering children. The Variety Care Program is designed to address the physical, mental, and emotional needs of children. By providing comprehensive support ranging from critical medical assistance to therapeutic intervention, the program ensures that every child receives the necessary care, effectively filling systemic gaps where existing support structures are insufficient.

The Variety Flying Start Paediatric Service, with the support of our program partner Marathon Health, is connecting vulnerable children in Western NSW with an experienced paediatrician through regular charter flights, providing families with access to a paediatric clinic in their safe and trusted local community. This fully integrated healthcare model provides the paediatrician with comprehensive information to fast-track care and diagnosis. A multidisciplinary team supports each visit, ensuring ongoing support and helping families unlock crucial assistance like the NDIS.

This year, we funded 16 flights enabling the Variety Allied Health Outreach Clinics to deliver 264 individual therapy sessions across remote communities including Bourke, Brewarrina, Walgett and Lightning Ridge, along with two Paediatric Clinics in Lightning Ridge and Walgett. These clinics brought essential health care closer to home for 67 children who would otherwise face long waitlists, costly and timeconsuming travel, and limited specialist support in their communities.





Thanks to this outreach model, children were not just seen once, they were connected into a pathway of care that supports their long-term development, wellbeing, and independence. Families repeatedly shared that being able to access specialists locally relieved both financial pressure and emotional stress, allowing their children to thrive without leaving their community.

In August, the program's success was acknowledged with the Collaboration Excellence Award at the Third Sector Awards, the largest and most prestigious awards ceremony recognising excellence within the Not-for-Profit sector. A huge thank you to everyone who voted for Variety and to Third Sector for this honour.

The Variety Therapy Grant offers vital financial assistance to children and families facing difficulty accessing clinicians due to financial hardship or NDIS ineligibility. This support is essential for development, improving quality of life, mental health, and school

participation. 98 therapy grants were provided in 2025 for speech therapy, occupational therapy, and psychology.

For over a decade, Variety has provided specialised wigs to children with permanent hair loss due to conditions like alopecia. Since one wig can cost up to \$6,000 and needs replacement, the cost is often prohibitive. By removing this financial barrier, we address the profound psychological effects of hair loss during childhood and adolescence.


Finally, the Variety Ward at The Children's Hospital at Westmead specialises in providing care to newborns and children requiring isolation. Here, we provide nourishing food packs for families who may be arriving after-hours and in moments of crisis. Nursing staff see every day how much this support means during the most difficult times - helping parents stay close to their children and offering comfort, connection, and care thanks to our generous donors and fundraisers.

# How We Help – Future

Variety is committed to equipping children for long-term success by focusing on education, skills development, and community inclusion. By providing access to diverse resources and experiences, we create opportunities that enable children to grow, thrive, and contribute to a more inclusive future.

Young people living in Out-of-Home Care, such as foster, kinship or residential care, often face unique and complex challenges. Many have experienced disrupted schooling, instability, and limited access to consistent health and wellbeing support. The Boost and Multi-Year Grants, funded by the Andrew Pratten Charitable Trust, help change that story by providing learning equipment, wellbeing resources, and opportunities to explore career and creative pathways. By removing barriers, the program builds confidence, independence, and a sense of belonging empowering young people to achieve their goals and thrive at school and in their community.

The Variety Heart Scholarship program, sponsored by the Grahame Mapp Family Foundation, is designed to assist talented students living with a disability, chronic illness, or financial hardship. The Scholarship facilitates the pursuit of their potential, with 96% of respondents reporting an improvement in their skills and performance in their chosen field.

\$327,000 in Variety Heart Scholarships were awarded to 92 children across NSW and the ACT in 2025. This year marked an incredible milestone for the program which has granted 525 scholarships valued at more than \$2 million since 2018.

Additionally, Variety provides a range of accessible annual events, such as our Variety Heart Scholarship Presentation evening and our Kids Xmas Parties, to ensure children, regardless of ability or background, can experience essential community joy and recognition. More than 2000 children attended our Kids Xmas parties in 2025.

Just Like You (JLY) is an innovative school-based program for students in Years 1 to 8 that fosters understanding, acceptance, and inclusion of people with a disability. It comprehensively addresses both visible and hidden disabilities, ensuring students appreciate the full spectrum of diversity. This year, Just Like You facilitators delivered workshops to more than 38,000 students at 136 schools across NSW and the ACT.





Cranebrook's Layla Sharp, who lives with cerebral palsy and vision impairment, first received a Variety Heart Scholarship in 2018 as a determined 10-year-old with a big dream - to represent Australia.

Now 17, Layla is the Australian T38 800m record holder and the 2024 NSW Para Women's 400m champion, having received over \$30,000 in support from Variety since her journey began.

This year, Layla achieved her lifelong goal by qualifying for the World Para Athletics Championships in New Delhi, where she competed in the 200m and 400m events. She placed 8th in the world for the 400m and 11th for the 200m, an outstanding debut on the international stage.

Focused and ambitious, Layla is now refining her race strategy and chasing new goals - the Commonwealth Games and the Paralympics.

"My Variety Heart Scholarships have meant the world to me," Layla said. "They've allowed me to compete, access expert coaching, and the latest equipment that I otherwise would not have been able to afford. Every record I've broken and every title I've won wouldn't have been possible without Variety's support. I'm forever grateful for their belief in young people like me and all that they do to help kids dreams come true."



# How We Help - Freedom

Variety is dedicated to providing children experiencing disadvantage with the essential tools required to navigate their world independently. Through access to adaptive mobility devices and social opportunities, we empower children to thrive, facilitating their ability to play, learn, and experience the fundamental joys of childhood.

The Variety Mobility Equipment Grant provides crucial, life-changing assistance to families struggling to access specialist disability equipment. This equipment drives improvements in children's physical development and independence, significantly increasing their participation in family activities and engagement within their community, thereby fostering inclusion at home, school, and within society.

In addition to this, the Variety Bikes for Kids program provides bicycles - gifted to Variety - to school communities facing low socio-economic barriers, offering practical support that enhances children's engagement and independence. In 2025, we delivered 36 bikes to two schools - Doonside Public School and Yeoval Public School. Our thanks to Storage Works Artarmon who provided storage of the bikes and Tamex Transport who delivered the bikes at no cost.

Our Variety Sunshine Coach program provides vital transportation for students to access educational, sporting, and community activities. While no new Sunshine Coaches were granted this year, we were delighted to deliver five coaches, granted over the

past two years, to Rutherford Technology High School, Mulyan Public School, Kalinda School, Yandelora School and Narrabri Public School. Many thanks to Woolworths and Toshiba for supporting this crucial program.

Our motoring events directly contribute to remote and regional communities via the Motoring Event Grant. During our visits in FY2025, we delivered 39 grants to schools and community groups for a range of items - from educational aids and sporting equipment to library resources, with each grant specifically tailored to their needs. Each overnight stop also boosts local tourism with up to \$70,000 injected into remote towns through food, fuel and accommodation costs.

Lastly, the Variety Community Grant delivers meaningful assistance packages to local groups making a difference. These grants remove practical barriers, offering support for essential needs such as funding for insulin pumps or accommodation for sporting groups traveling interstate, thereby creating life-changing opportunities for children experiencing disadvantage.







CALE'S STORY

Sixteen-year-old Cale is an adventurous, music-loving teen who's faced life with determination since being diagnosed with cerebral palsy just before his first birthday. His parents sold their home in Far North Queensland and moved to Sydney to access the therapies and support he needed. Over the years, they adapted their home for accessibility and, with help from Variety, received a manual wheelchair that improved Cale's mobility.

But their biggest dream was to share their love of the outdoors - to ride and explore together as a family. Living near mountain bike trails in Sydney's Sutherland Shire, they longed for a way Cale could join them. After being twice denied NDIS funding for an Adaptive Mountain Bike, costing over \$30,000, the family turned to Variety.

Thanks to a Variety Mobility Equipment Grant, Cale finally received his own Adaptive Mountain Bike, opening a whole new world of independence and adventure. Now he rides alongside his family and uses the bike with his support worker.

"This bike has changed Cale's life," says his mum, Janine. "He's no longer on the sidelines - he's free, confident, and doing what he loves. Variety gave him the chance to truly belong."

Day one saw KPMG staff hit the bikes with incredible energy, fundraising with passion and purpose. Day two brought together a powerhouse of corporate teams from across Barangaroo and the city, all spinning, cheering, and digging deep to support kids in need.

The atmosphere was electric, with teams riding in shifts and rallying around a shared goal. Our thanks for the incredible generosity of our participants,

donors, and the unwavering support from KPMG, and International Towers Barangaroo.

The 9th Newcastle Spin 4 Kids was held at the beautiful Fort Scratchley, raising more than \$50,000. #### HAIR WITH HEART

Every year, thousands of generous Australians take part in Variety's Hair with Heart program, showing that even the smallest act of kindness can make a lifechanging difference. By cutting, colouring, or shaving their hair, supporters raise vital funds to provide medical-grade wigs for children who have lost their hair due to alopecia, cancer, trichotillomania, and other medical conditions.

The impact of this generosity is profound. A custommade medical wig can cost around \$6,000 and typically lasts just 18 months to two years as a child's head grows. This places it well beyond the reach of many families. It can take up to 20 ponytails to create a single wig, meaning this is a true team effort of compassion in action.

Thanks to the incredible commitment of Hair with Heart supporters, more than 260 children across Australia have received wigs since 2018. This year, Hair Heroes from all over Australia chopped their locks, shaved their head, or coloured their hair, raising more than \$610,000 and donating more than 2,000 ponytails to make more wigs possible.

Every dollar raised helps turn anxiety into assurance and gives a child the priceless gift of choice and confidence. Because it's not just about hair - it's about heart.

Variety's iconic motoring events once again hit the road this year, combining adventure, camaraderie, and compassion to create brighter futures for kids in need.

Across the Postie Bike Dash, 4WD Adventure, Adventure Ride, NSW Bash and B to B Bash, our incredible community of participants, sponsors, and volunteers raised more than \$3.5 million to support children who are sick, experiencing disadvantage or living with a disability.

Together, our motoring community travelled through some of Australia's most remote and breathtaking landscapes - from the rugged tracks of the Blue Mountains and Abercrombie National Park to the open roads of regional New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia.

Along the way, our 725 motoring event participants travelled to 39 remote and regional schools and community groups delivering more than \$174,000 in grants for inclusive classrooms

#### 2024 VARIETY POSTIE BIKE DASH

The 2024 Variety Postie Bike Dash saw 91 Dashers travel more than 1300 kilometres across regional New South Wales and Victoria, raising an incredible \$371,000 to support kids in need. Over six actionpacked days, our Dashers visited seven schools and community groups, hand-delivering more than \$33,000 in grants for vital learning tools, sports gear, and creative resources.


The journey began in Yass, where the Dashers were cheered on by the Yass Football Club and presented a grant for new playing jerseys. Breakfast the next day was at Holbrook Public School who received a grant for a projector and Bluetooth technology before the convoy rolled into Wangaratta.

At Bright P-12 College, Dashers enjoyed breakfast with the students and delivered a grant for art supplies and hiking packs, before stopping at Corowa Public School to deliver a grant for outdoor musical instruments.

The following day featured a school visit to North Wagga Public School who received a grant for adjustable flexi stools, a calming canoe and basketball hoop. Back on the road, Dashers made their way to Ardlethan Central School for some fun and games over lunchtime, not to mention a grant for woodworking and science equipment to ensure students can engage in all classes.

A visit to Cootamundra School rounded off the week with a grant for therapy pods and ukeleles before the Dashers closed the loop and headed back to Yass.

#### 2025 VARIETY 4WD ADVENTURE

2025 marked an incredible 20 years of the Variety 4WD Adventure and we celebrated with not one but two epic, seven-day expeditions through six aweinspiring National Parks.

The events began in the beauty of Malua Bay and featured stunning river crossings and demanding terrain that called for intricate driving techniques along rugged off-road tracks through Deua, Brindabella, Blue Mountains, Abercrombie River, Turon and Marrangaroo National Parks, before finishing in Katoomba.

In the 20-year history of the event, more than \$3 million has been raised with more than 400 cars and almost 1000 entrants coming together to make friends and make a difference in the lives of families and kids in need.

This year was once again a success with 98 amazing Adventurers raising over \$370,000 across both events.

In addition to raising funds and exploring the stunning backroads, our Adventurers also helped to deliver more than \$28,000 in grants to six schools across NSW and the ACT.

The students at these schools are now enjoying a range of new resources from STEM equipment and football goals to literacy packs, musical instruments, and craft kits.

2025 VARIETY NSW BASH

The 2025 Variety NSW Bash saw 219 entrants and 31 official volunteers travel more than 3000 kilometres across regional NSW, all with one powerful goal in mind - supporting kids in need.

Sadly, the event didn't conclude exactly as planned given the extreme rainfall which caused major flooding in the Hunter and Mid North Coast regions. We are deeply grateful for everyone's understanding and cooperation which helped us to prioritise the safety of our motoring participants and the wider community.

Despite the challenges, together we raised \$1.1 million and delivered grants valued at more than \$46,000 to ten schools and community groups in remote and regional communities.

#### 2025 VARIETY B TO B BASH

In recognition of the 50th anniversary of Variety in Australia, the 2025 B to B Bash became part of a 'National Bash' celebration - with Bashers from across the country coming together in South Australia.

Departing from Bomaderry in August, our 230 Bashers wound their way through the rugged Australian outback bringing colour and cheer to remote communities before uniting with more than 1500 entrants and 650 cars that had travelled to Adelaide for the first National Variety Bash in a decade.

#### 2025 VARIETY ADVENTURE RIDE
