Our 30th Anniversary Bash was another outstanding success fundraising over \$400K and retracing, in reverse, the original route from Alice Springs to Darwin. This year, Sign City was recognised with the Variety International Small Corporate Award. 

4 year old Silas lives with Autism Spectrum Disorder Level 3 and is Non-Verbal, he also has Sensory Processing Disorder. Silas needed specialised play equipment that would allow him to work on his play and communication in the safety of his home.

Caleb

Caleb was diagnosed with CHARGE syndrome, a term that refers to a specific set of birth defects, medical problems and developmental issues, including heart defects. He is legally blind and has severe to profound hearing loss. Caleb has had open heart surgery and is fed through a percutaneous endoscopic gastrostomy (PEG). While his challenges are many, Caleb just loves to swim at the Variety Starfish Swim Group.

Mataranka School

Mataranka School is a small remote school with around 35 students enrolled. As a small school they have difficulty in fundraising enough to pay for items such as for student learning and engagement in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths). The school won a Bash Grant which enabled them to purchase some up to date materials.

"As the students have begun to explore these resources they have developed a variety of problem solving, team work and critical thinking skills. These resources have and will continue to benefit our students."





Mantiyupwi Family Trust

The Mantiyupwi Family Group are the traditional owners of the Wurrumiyanga township and surrounding areas on the Tiwi Islands. As part of their vision to provide healthy lifestyle options into their community the Mantiyupwi are building a bike pump track, leading to the need for bikes to make use of the track. Using the bikes will provide sporting, health, educational and cultural outcomes.

Foster Stavridis Scholarship

Named in memory of Foster Stavridis, this scholarship seeks to support two areas of his interests, sport and kids with a disability. The scholarship sends two NT kids to attend the Variety Kids Sports Camp in Townsville.

The Variety Kids Sports Camp offers kids living with a physical disability the opportunity to try out a variety of different sports to determine which they enjoy and want to continue playing. It is a two and a half day experience open to kids aged between 6 – 15 years old.

This year Max and Arden got to experience the camp. Arden lives with spastic diplegia cerebral palsy and Max lives with hereditatry choare and dystonic cerebral palsy. The kids and their Mums travelled to Townsville for two and a half days of hectic fun.

The camp covered athletics, rugby league, basketball, boccia, swimming, and taekwondo. They had panel discussions and a talent quest. They even got to meet not one but two Paralympians Chantel Wolfendon OAM and Natalie Curtis.

Variety Starfish Swim Group

Founder and Volunteer Coordinator Donna Rousham and Administrator Paul Rousham, both Variety NT Life Members, have continued their outstanding dedication for helping kids with a disability to learn to swim.

Up to 75 NT kids have learnt vital living around water skills and reaped the associated health benefits. While Variety NT continues to support this vital community service, including dedicating the fundraising from the Santa Fun Run for this specific cause.



Freedom Camp @ Goanna Park

Back after a two year pandemic break, Freedom Camp, an adventure camp for teenagers with a mild to moderate disability returned. A relatively small group of 15 campers aged between 13 and 18 years old ventured out to enjoy the outdoor activities, test their talents, consume copious amounts of food, make friends and gain a sense of self. The success of Freedom Camp includes the dedication of the many volunteers who assist, the Junior Police Rangers who participate as camper buddies and our sponsors.
