# Prabhroop

Prabhroop is 9 years old and has a diagnoses of Autism Spectrum Disorder. He has sensory processing difficulties, an expressive and receptive language delay and he only speaks in single words. Prabhroop is not eligible for participation in the NDIS. His Speech Pathologist highly recommended the use of a speech generating device, specifically Accent 800 with Unity-60 Sequenced Vocabulary. The cost of \$7,923 exceeded the family's financial means. Variety NT provided a grant, enabling Prabhroop to access the communication device and find his voice.

# Sadie

Sadie is 7 years old with DDX3X syndrome and lives in Alice Springs. Sadie needed a very special Trike to help her join in the family activities.

"Our family is so grateful and thankful for the Huka Orthros tandem bike that Sadie received from Variety NT. Our family can adventure together at long last! Sadie loves the feeling of riding, and has been working on her balancing and pedalling. Her bike is a real conversation starter, and fosters inclusion for Sadie in our suburb, with everyone we pass saying "cool bike" "wow" "looks like fun".

"We feel really humbled to have been gifted the Huka, it brings Sadie so much joy, and we love how expressive and excited she is when riding and the concentration she uses to pedal and steer. The Huka will last us for years to come, it can sit two adults side by side. We look forward to hitting the pavement at every opportunity! We appreciate Variety and it's volunteers so much, the fundraising, events, bush bashers and admin team. Our thanks will never express how much you have changed Sadie's life." – Sadie's Mum

## Isolated Children's Parents Association: Alice Springs Branch

"Geographically isolated children in Central Australia have been without access to early learning opportunities prior to school for more than a decade. Funding from Variety has allowed the Isolated Children's Parents Association in partnership with RAISEducation to deliver four early learning playgroups across Central Australia in 2023 at Harts Range, Ti Tree, Kulgera and Erldunda.

More than 50 children under 5 years of age and their families attend these playgroups which has allowed our community to build friendships and resilience by connecting with other rural families.



Providing early learning opportunities to geographically isolated children in Central Australia has meant these children have the opportunity to interact, build confidence, and learn important social and emotional skills which is the foundation for learning and succeeding once they enrol in primary school." – ICPA Board Member



# **Riding for the Disabled**

In 2023, we maintained our commitment to supporting Riding for the Disabled Assoc. Top End by contributing to the purchase of a size-appropriate horse. This addition became necessary due to the tragic loss of a previous horse. We are pleased to welcome Duckie, (Pegasus Park Princess), a 6-year-old Welsh Pony. Duckie now joins a stable of horse friends dedicated to facilitating safe, healthy, and stimulating therapeutic horse-related activities, benefiting up to 50 children annually.

## Friends of School Sport Scholarship

The Friends of School Sport NT Foundation (FOSS) was established with the aim of enabling all children to participate in sports. This year, in collaboration with FOSS, the Variety NT School Sport Scholarship was introduced. It is to assist children residing in remote areas to attend the NT School Track and Field Championships, specifically in the multi-class events.

Dhunggala Ganambarr from East Arnhem region is our first scholarship winner. Dhunggala has a hearing impairment and travelled from his remote community with a guide to support him in the competition. Dhunggala not only participated with determination but also won many medals, and his smile says it all.



# Variety Starfish Swim Group

The Starfish Swim Group was formed in 2005 when Donna Rousham recognised the need to assist children with special needs to learn to swim and be safe in the water with one-on-one self pace-based instruction. The aim is to provide an opportunity for families who have children with a disability to access a free learn to swim skills program.

Now, the Variety NT Starfish Swim Group with the principal sponsor and dedicated supporter, Variety NT, has seen the program successfully continue to grow this vital community service. Variety NT dedicates the fundraising from the Variety NT Santa Fun Run for this specific cause. The major sponsors are Mimik-ga-Centre and Henbury School, who provide their pools and maintenance at no cost.

Programs run from 1pm – 6.30pm Monday to Friday every week for 6 years to 12 years. The 13 to 18 years attend lessons on Monday and Tuesdays from 2.30pm – 6pm. The weekly program also includes a "Mums and Bubs" program, 6 months to 5 years, on a Saturday morning.

The programs are coordinated every week by Variety Life Member Donna Rousham who now has over 80 participants.

# Freedom Camp @ Goanna Park

Twenty (20) teenagers aged between 13 to 18 years, enjoyed Freedom Camp, an adventure camp for teenagers with a mild to moderate disability. The group not only enjoyed the rock climbing and abseiling at Adventure Bound, they also experienced some programs new to the camp. Shooting hoops with Hoops 4 Health, STEM activities in Casuarina Library and Theatre skills with Corrugated Iron Youth Theatre all joined the jam packed program that ensures the campers have maximum fun and learnt a few things too.

The success of Freedom Camp includes the dedication of the many volunteers who assist, the Junior Police Rangers who participate as camper buddies and our sponsors.
