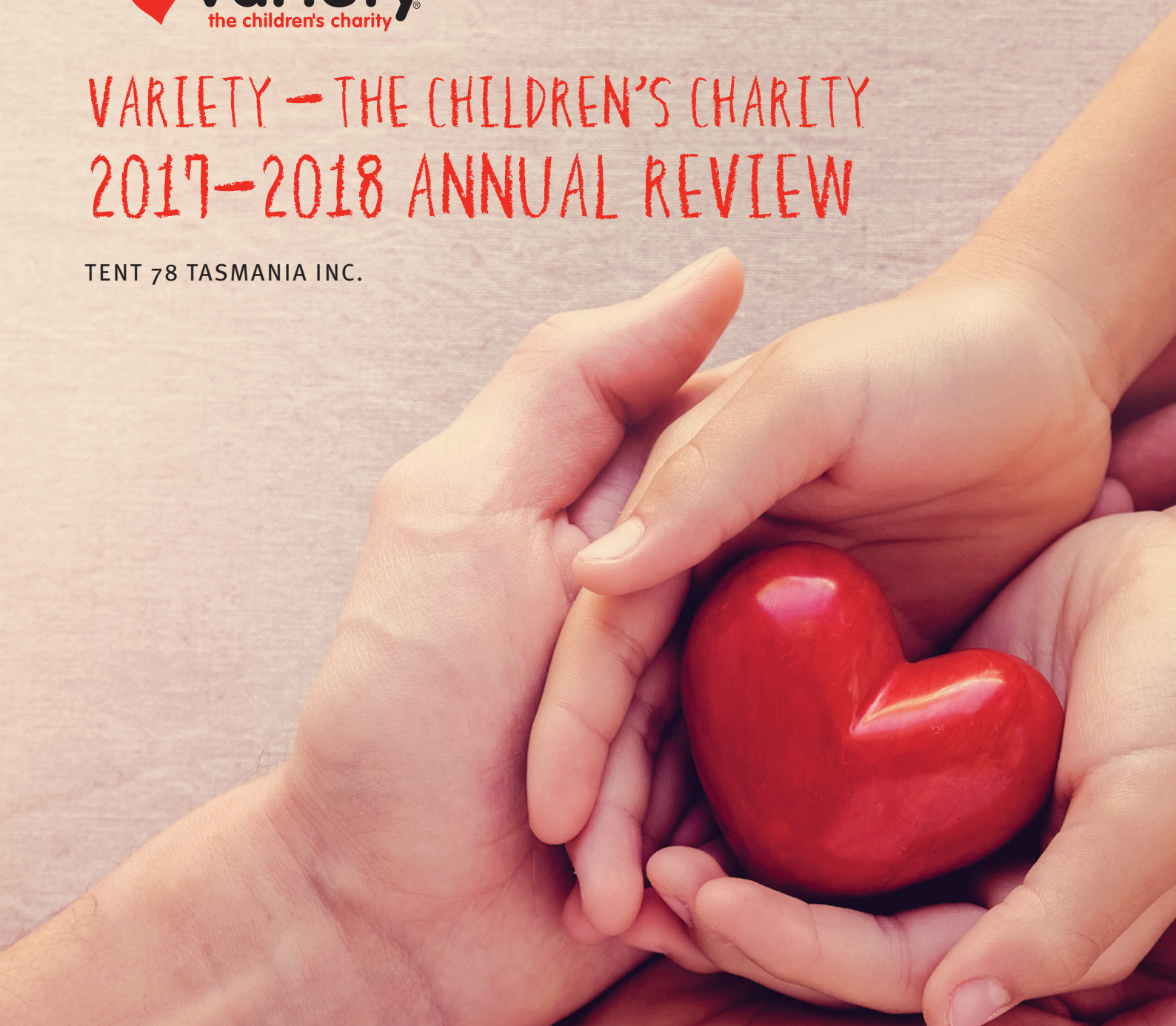

OUR PROGRAMS

Variety – the Children’s Charity Tasmania works directly with individual families and organisations to empower Tasmanian children who are sick, disadvantaged or have special needs to live, laugh and learn.

Funds are distributed through our three core programs:

Variety Freedom Program

is the gift of independence, self-esteem, mobility and communication. The Freedom Program aims to assist children to gain mobility and independence through the provision of equipment such as wheelchairs, positioning systems and postural splints. The ultimate outcome is to enable everyday activities such as moving safely while playing and not expending too much energy on just remaining upright. In the broader context it also enables children to join in family and community activities such as going for a walk, cycling and going to the beach.



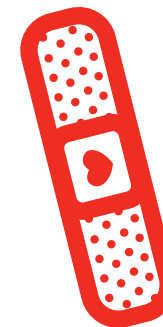
Variety Future Kids Program

is the gift of education achievement, experiences and play. The Future Program aims to ensure children have a positive, interactive classroom experience through the provision of computerised communication and learning systems. The challenges and frustrations for a child when they are unable to just simply communicate are immense. A specific aspect of the Future Kids Program is the provision of **scholarships** to assist children to achieve their full potential in the areas of the arts, music and sports.



Variety Caring for Kids Program

is the gift of support, survival and recovery. The Caring for Kids Program is about supporting children’s health and wellbeing through the provision of medical equipment such as insulin pumps and nebulisers. This equipment enables the child to be cared for in their own home, minimising the need for hospital admissions, disruptions to family life, as well as alleviating some of the financial burden associated with managing chronic and rare conditions.

In conjunction with Variety NSW, Variety Tasmania also supports the **Wigs for Kids Program** which provides specialised wigs for children who have lost their hair either temporarily or permanently.

Meet Jayden

Continued from 2017.

In 2017, Jayden's family came to Variety Tasmania looking for support to purchase a 'smartpup' assistance dog, to help their 9-year-old son who is completely blind, non-verbal, has global delay and cerebral palsy and is wheelchair bound.

Jayden's team of carers determined that an assistance dog was required for both companionship, assistance with everyday living and to facilitate therapy for Jayden. They foresee that Jayden will be able to improve his fine and gross motor skills by undertaking activities such as grooming the dog and throwing the ball for the dog. It is also anticipated that the dog will assist Jayden by opening and closing cupboards and helping to carry and retrieve items. In addition to this, the companionship of the dog will improve Jayden's confidence and independence.

An assistance dog is not an overnight gift. In Jayden's case, it will be 18 months from the time his grant was approved until Bella joins him this December.

Meet Sam

Continued from 2017.

In 2017, Variety granted a scholarship to Sam Walker, a (then) 14-year-old boy with Asperger's and mild spastic cerebral palsy, who knows how to run and jump! The aim of the scholarship was to get Sam to the World Para Athletics Junior Championships in Switzerland and the All Schools Championship in Adelaide. These events gave Sam the opportunity to experience competing at national and international levels and enabled him to post qualifying times for selection into Australia's Commonwealth Games team for the 2018 games, held on the Gold Coast in April 2018.

And qualify he did! At the end of those two major competitions, Sam held the Australian records for the:

- Under 16 100 metres; • Under 16 200 metres; • Under 16 long jump;
- Under 16 shotput; and • Under 16, under 18 and under 20 high jump.

The ultimate aim of the scholarship was achieved, and Sam was the youngest Australian male athlete ever selected to compete in an athletics event at the Commonwealth Games. In his 100m sprint event, Sam came 6th, ran a personal best, and broke the under 18 Australian record which has stood for 16 years. He is now ranked 9th in the world in this event, which is exceptional for his age.

Sam's aim now is to compete in the World Para Athletics Junior Championships again in 2019, and ultimately to qualify for the Tokyo Paralympics in 2020.

It is Sam's hard work and commitment to the sport that has shaped him into the athlete that he is today, but it is your support of Variety Tasmania that enabled Sam to receive the scholarship that helped him unlock his potential skills and enabled him to the best he can be.

Sam and his family have asked Variety Tasmania to pass on their "heartfelt thankyou to Variety Tasmania and all of their supporters; without their ongoing support Sam would never have been able to compete in these competitions that have paved the path for him being selected for the Commonwealth Games".

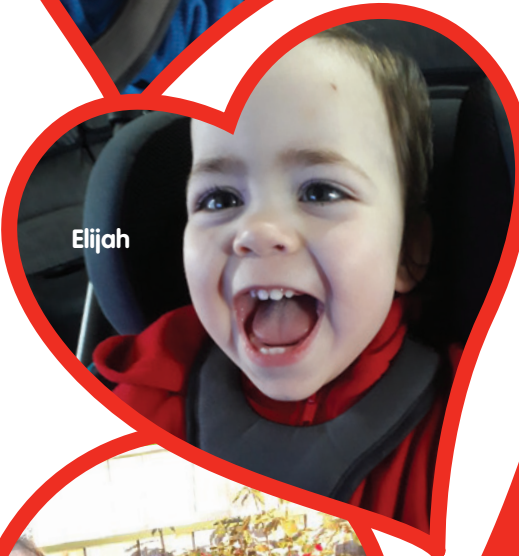


Meet Timothy & Elijah

Timothy & Elijah are identical twins, who were born with their sister as an amazing triplet addition to a family of four. Both Timothy and Elijah have been diagnosed with hypotonic cerebral palsy, epileptic encephalopathy and global development delay.

Variety Tasmania provided a grant to assist in the purchase of Bingo Evo strollers for the boys, which will allow proper head and neck support for the twins as they grow. The strollers can be locked together, meaning only one parent is required to manoeuvre the boys when the family is out and about, leaving the other parent free to shepherd the family's other three children.

"We are ever so grateful to Variety Tasmania for their generous contribution towards these amazing Bingo Evolution strollers. Our sons Timothy and Elijah have severe hypotonic quadriplegic cerebral palsy and without Variety's help we would not have been able to afford this custom stroller – let alone two of them. We are so relieved our miracle boys have seating that finally gives them the optimal head and lateral support they require, which could not be achieved from their regular prams. Timothy and Elijah both love their new chairs and new-found view of the world, as they are able to be seated at the same level and in a more upright position". Emily Page, August 2018.

The second Variety of Gins was held in the beautiful Royal Tasmanian Botanical Gardens on 2nd March 2018 and attracted 120 guests.

This is a hosted, guided, progressive tasting experience of locally crafted gins matched with canapés made from local produce by the team at Succulent. This event started at the Conservatory as the 'lobby' to meet before we started the evening. Guests then wandered through the beautiful gardens with the roving Army Band playing a genre of music that complimented the evening perfectly. The heroes of the evening were the gin makers of course!

David Kernke kicked off the evening with a perfect Shene Estate and Distillery cocktail, followed by a Forty Spotted Gin from Lark Distillery and introduced by Nick Devereux. This enchanted walk culminated at the Lily Pond, where we were welcomed by Tom McHenry with McHenry Distillery gins in hand.

An auction was held at the event, with generous prizes offered by MACq 01, Code Rock Bicheno, Lenna of Hobart, George Baily and Chartley Estate.

Variety of Gins was the very first event to ever take place at the newly upgraded Lily Pond. It was held weeks before HRH Prince Edward unveiled the plaque marking the Royal Tasmanian Botanical Gardens bicentenary.

Guests were serenaded by Mark Holden, with a few guests being particularly taken by the world famous Australian singer and TV personality. Variety Federal Group TasBash

The 2018 Variety Federal Group TasBash left Turners Beach in north-west Tasmania on the 25th October 2018 for an adventurous journey over four days to Elwick Racecourse in Hobart. The 28th TasBash included 10 cars, with participants from as far away as New Zealand and Queensland. Intrepid Bash Director Dave Flower, his partner Trish Lewis, Craig Rogerson (aka Rogo) and Janet Rogerson planned a beautiful scenic route which included forests, rivers, the beach and the odd stray sheep.

On the first day, the Bashers were waved off the starting blocks by Roger Jaensch, MP for Braddon, and stopped at two schools on their way through to Grindelwald in Launceston. The school visits are always the highlight for the Bashers and this year was no exception. Sprent School welcomed the Bash Cars as they paraded into the school ground with their sirens and music playing. The Bashers then handed out fun items to the children including stamps, colouring books, bubbles and clappers, while our Superheros kicked a football around with the children. We were then invited into the library to view the furniture that Variety Tasmania had donated and were presented with their own fundraising that the children had undertaken.

The next stop was the School of Special Education North-West – Devonport where the children were thrilled to hop into the cars, while the Bashers learnt about the difference their donated outdoor exercise equipment is going to make for the school and the students. The school also kindly provided a lovely lunch for the Bashers, with the children helping to make and decorate the desserts. From Devonport we headed to Grindelwald for the first evening entertainment, through Beaconsfield for a quick rest. All teams went above and beyond the call of duty for their costumes for the evening themes, with teams dressing as Hansel and Gretel, and even red and white lollies for the first night.

On the second day, the Bashers visited South Georgetown Primary School, which received eight bicycles from the Variety Grants. The children encouraged the Bashers to get up and

dance with them before they left to go to Lilydale Primary School. Prior to a delicious lunch hosted by Lilydale Primary School, the Bashers treated the children to bubbles and clappers, which were an immediate hit with the children, if not so much with the teachers. The trip through to Scamander was made along beautiful forest roads, with a few challenging river crossings. And no matter how well written the route directions, there will always be someone who gets lost. While forgivable for the Clampettes from Queensland, it took some skill for the Sweep to get lost as well. The Scamander Beach Hotel Motel hosted a fabulous community event with a spit roast and live entertainment for the Friday evening.

Day three brought with it shaving exercises on cream filled balloons for the fun stop and a lovely lunch at the Eastcoaster before a beautiful drive through Marion Bay down to Lufra. It was also the first day the Clampettes did not get lost.

The final day of TasBash 2018 saw the Bashers arrive with a police escort to Elwick Racecourse, where they were piped in over the finish line by the Derwent Scottish Pipe Band. Glenorchy Mayor, Kristie Johnston was on hand to welcome the Bashers through to Glenorchy and the ExitLeft Performance Academy put on a special performance for the Bashers and the community. The TasBash Parade was supported by the Rotary Club of Glenorchy who ran the sausage sizzle, Allegro Espresso Tas providing excellent coffee and Face Painting for All Occasions for the little guests.

The 2018 TasBash culminated in a private lunch for the Bashers and officials at Elwick Racecourse, where they were entertained by the BrightStars dance group of Down Syndrome Tasmania. Their passion and enthusiasm for dancing was so moving – suffice to say there was not a dry eye in the room.

- In 2017/2018 Variety Tasmania approved funding requests for resources and equipment that will benefit 373 Tassie kids.
- The kids assisted by Variety Tasmania experience a range of conditions including but not limited to: postural abnormalities, alopecia, cerebral palsy, hyper-mobility (floppy joints) and autism.
- The age of the children assisted ranged from one year to 14 years of age.
- Some of the granted resources and equipment will benefit a child for one year, while others will still be providing a benefit for all of their life.

Benefits achieved from the granted resources and equipment include:

- The ability to be active without the risk of joint instability and/or joint pain
- The opportunity to engage and communicate with peers
- Enhanced learning opportunities
- Improved gross motor skills
- Growth in confidence and ability
- The freedom to move independently
- The opportunity to go out as a family and participate in community events
- The opportunity to be the best they can be
