

Introduction

The Variety Freya Fund is the legacy of Freya Williamson. The Williamson family, who loved and cared for Freya for 21 years have been inspired by their own lived experiences, to help families who have children with severe disabilities.

Variety Freya Fund provides a relief payment of up to \$1,000 directly to Tasmanian families who care for a child with: additional needs or a severe disability; bereavement support following the loss of their child; serious, acute, or chronic illness or additional physical and emotional needs.

At Variety Tasmania's discretion, the amount may be increased in exceptional circumstances, or a family of a deserving child/ren, with a combined household annual income of less than \$60,000.

The Fund is designed to be as flexible as possible to help relieve individual families at a time of need or financial distress and when experiencing additional emotional and physical challenges.

Eligibility for the Variety Freya Fund is carefully thought-out, particularly respecting and upholding the dignity of those families. Recipients should be **nominated** by a GP, therapist, specialist, teacher, caseworker, or allied health professional who has a direct and intimate knowledge of the family's situation.

Calling a family, at a time of need to let them know they have been nominated and will receive up to \$1,000 from the Variety Freya Fund, is the best gift anyone can offer.

Eligibility and Nomination

- Variety Freya Fund benefits families and carers of children, under 18 years old, with severe disabilities, serious, acute, or chronic illness.
- The family **cannot** apply directly for a Variety Freya Fund themselves.
- Nominations can be made by Health Professionals, Allied Health Professionals, or other professionals who are aware of the family's circumstances.
- The nominated family must reside in Tasmania.
- Variety Tasmania has the right to contact the nominated families as part of the grant assessment process to determine eligibility.
- If needed, Variety Tasmania has the right to contact the nominator for additional details.
- Applications are open all year round.
- This is a cash relief payment and can only be made directly to the nominated family.

Decision

Successful nominations:

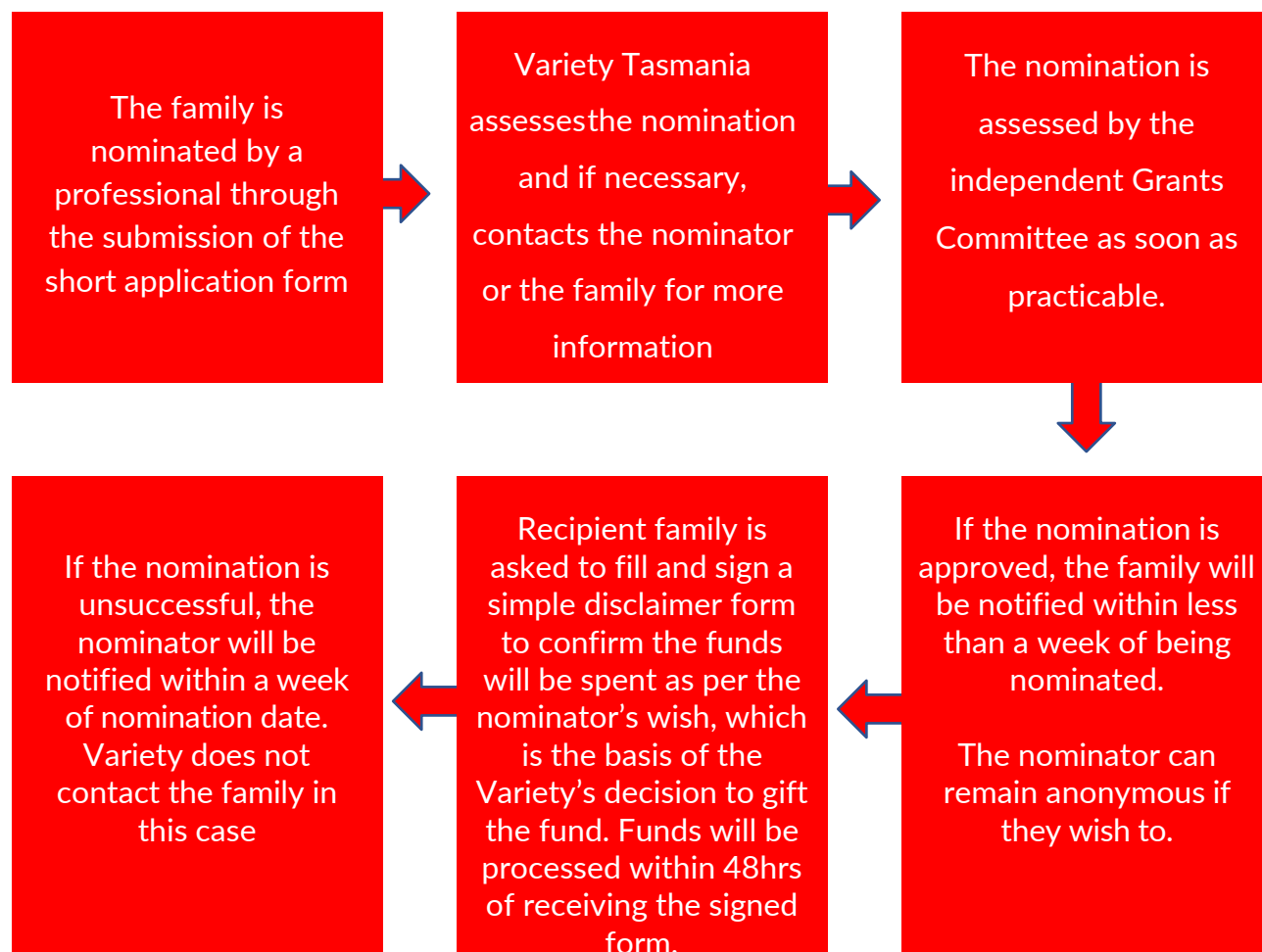
- If the grant is approved, the family will be notified by telephone and with a

- formal, written letter within 7 working days of being notified.
- The name of the nominator will be shared with the family only if the nomination was successful and the nominator opted to be identified to the recipient family.
- Families/carers have 3 months from the date of their grant approval letter to submit their bank details for the grant to be paid to them.
- This is a one-off grant. Families will not be eligible for another Variety Freya Fund gift.
- Variety's decision is final.

Unsuccessful nominations:

- If the grant nomination is not approved, the nominator will be notified via email within 4 weeks after their initial submission.
- Reasons pertaining to unsuccessful nominations are at the discretion of Variety Tasmania.
- Unsuccessful nominations will not impact the family's ability to apply under a different grant stream such as an Individual Grant.

Did You Know?

Variety is dedicated to empowering Tassie children who are sick, disadvantaged or have additional needs and who would otherwise fall through the gaps of the system.

Simply put, if there is a child living in Tasmania who needs help but can't get it from anywhere else, Variety would like to be there for them. Variety's support is available through the following:

- **Grants** - we provide individual and community grants for equipment, supplies and therapy that are not funded by government or other organisations. We also grant wigs for children who have lost their hair due to medical condition, such as Alopecia or cancer.
- **Scholarships** - we provide scholarships to encourage children with an existing talent and enable them to reach their full potential and to follow their dreams. Scholarships are available in the areas of Arts, Sport, Education and Business.
- **Programs** - we run programs to educate and empower children such as the Variety Creative Arts Program and Bikes4Kids. The Creative Arts Program is delivered in small groups at schools within a safe and welcoming environment, facilitated by a qualified creative arts therapist. The program offers children a creative means for self-expression that supports their emotional wellbeing and development.
- **Experiences** - we hold inclusive events that bring joy to children and their families. Such as Quiet Santa and Variety Day @ Zoodoo.
