Things are getting bigger and better at Variety -the Children's Charity Victoria.

2017 saw the triumphant return of the Variety Bikes 4 Kids program spearheaded by Senator Derryn Hinch, which raised over \$53,000.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors and supporters, we were able to gift 200 children with brand new bikes at a special presentation at Hisense Arena. The presentation was a unique experience for our donors which allowed them to meet and greet the children who were receiving the bikes.

We also launched our brand new Variety SHINE Intensive Program which gives children with language and learning problems the help they need to keep up with their mates in the classroom.

The inaugural SHINE program will take place in January, during the school holidays, and we look forward to welcoming more children into the course in 2019.

It has been an extraordinary 12 months for Variety - the Children's Charity Victoria. Together we have impacted more than double the number of children; increasing from 9,153 to 24,946 and thanks to your generous support, we have also increased our total amount granted by \$71,362.

Max

Life without speech was all Max knew until he was five years old. Despite being one of eight children, he was non-verbal and his parents feared he may never speak. Now eight years old, Max can talk but he is often hard to understand due to living with Autism, as well as an intellectual disability. In October, Max attended our Variety Bikes 4 Kids presentation with his mum Mandy. "When Max got his bike he hugged the man who handed it to him and said, *I love it man*, *I love it so much*, it really made me cry," she said, astounded that something as simple as a bike could elicit such a clear, emotional response from her son.

Sam

Being in a wheelchair would slow some people down, but not Sam. Having undergone multiple operations throughout his life, he hasn't let Spina Bifida hold him back. In 2013, Sam got his first taste of wheelchair racing when he borrowed a specialised racing chair and in 2014 Variety awarded him the Variety Young Sports Achiever Award for his incredible achievements. In 2017, Sam took his first overseas trip, where he represented Australia at the World Para-Athletics Junior Championships, bringing home one silver and three bronze medals. Variety is proud to have been able to provide Sam with a brand new racing wheelchair to call his own, which we hope will help him to reach his dreams of making it to the Paralympics.





Cooper

For nine year old Cooper, being diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD) means that he has to deal with chronic pain in his lower legs and feet. This degenerative condition causes severe muscle weakness and can also bring on breathing difficulties and heart problems. Most boys with DMD lose the ability to walk independently around the time they turn 10, but thanks to our incredible donors, Variety was able to provide Cooper with a Powered Standing Wheelchair. This wheelchair gives Cooper access to bench tops, desks and counter tops, and enables him to have more face-to-face conversations with his peers, teachers and family. Normally a shy boy, Cooper couldn't wait to take the chair to school to show his friends his new found independence in the playground.

Ace

Aicardi-Goutieres Sydrome has calcified parts of Ace's brain, resulting in him living with severe cerebral palsy and an intellectual disability. Ace needs help to move, communicate, eat and to bathe; basically all aspects of his day to day life. Ace is at significant risk of developing spinal problems, along with a high risk of food going into his lungs while eating if he is not seated in a supported, safe position. Since Variety provided him with a Wombat Supportive Seating System, Ace has been able to maintain a healthy posture for an extended period of time and eat safely. This chair can be adjusted to suit a range of table heights, and it can be rolled between rooms to make life easier for both him and his carers.





Finn

Cheeky three year old Finn is full of beans despite living with a rare genetic disorder which is characterised by contractures of his muscles, low muscle tone and a developmental delay. He can't stand without support, let alone walk or run like other kids his age. Variety was able to provide Finn with a walking frame at this critical stage of development, which will enable him to explore the world around him. According to Finn's mum, when Finn got his walker, he propelled himself over to where his sister was drawing and pulled her hair. In response, Madison got up and put the brakes on her suddenly mobile brother!

Hayley

Variety first met this gorgeous girl when she was just three years old. We watched her take her first steps with the help of a David Hart Walker, provided by our generous donors. Previously restricted to commando crawling or rolling herself into a sitting position on the floor, the walker gave Hayley the sense of freedom and independence that she had been waiting years for. Ten years and four pieces of equipment from Variety later, Hayley has blossomed into a fiercely determined young lady who doesn't let anything hold her back. She participates in Riding for the Disabled and has won numerous accolades. Hayley even holds fundraising events of her own to give back to Variety in the hope of helping other kids with special needs just like her.





Anna

Around the Variety office. Anna is most commonly referred to as the future Prime Minister of Australia. At only 127cm tall, this bright, confident young lady has a personality that more than makes up for her small stature. Living with Arthrogryposis Multiplex Congenita means that Anna has limited mobility and range of movement due to a lack of muscle development and her spinal vertebrae being fused. Variety was able to provide Anna with an electric scooter, allowing her to move quickly between classes at high school, reducing fatigue and increasing the amount of time she can spend learning in the classroom. It also has handy on-board storage for her school books and folds down so it can be transported with her on school excursions and camps which means she can engage in extra curricular activities with her peers.

Lachie

Lachie is a delightful boy with a great sense of humour and a cheeky grin, but living with Autism and ADHD has made it hard for him to concentrate for extended periods in the classroom. Lachie also has trouble forming words which has been formally diagnosed as speech apraxia. This means it's hard for his brain to communicate with his mouth, so his words come out sounding a little strange sometimes. Lachie was struggling to keep up with his peers in the classroom, but thanks to Variety, he now has an iPad which helps his Occupational Therapist, teachers and family to track his progress, ensuring Lachie reaches important educational milestones and achieves his full potential.
