Through 2016 the link between Board Members and staff has developed well, allowing cohesion in pursing the strategic plan developed earlier this year.

#### Our Goals are to:

- 1. Source funds so we can make significant appeals;
- 2. Produce "Must Attend" events to drive our source of funds;
- 3. Build sustainable and diverse fundraising programs;
- 4. Develop new and innovative ideas;
- 5. Build a high profile name; and
- 6. Secure an efficient team of Volunteers, Staff and Board members to extend our reach and impact.

The aim is to work towards providing \$2,000,000 in grants per year, by the year 2020 and we are definitely heading in the right direction with \$1.2m granted in the 2016 year.

#### MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

The development of the Variety Foundation is now bearing fruit aided by a number of direct donations and bequests.

Our aim with the Foundation is to have the returns from the investment portfolio covering the operating costs of the organisation, so that the grant ratio can move firmly towards 100%; meaning all revenue received, less the costs of hosting events, are granted to children in need

The matrix of Board Member skills and experience is now diverse, covering many business requirements. We have also linked the skills of members of the Board with members of staff so that the initiatives of volunteer directors are progressed on a daily basis.

Areas such as fundraising, sponsorships, major donations and bequests, marketing and communications, events, the Foundation, finance, and grants, are overseen by directors working with staff within the office

Under the CEO's watch, the relationship between the Board and the office has been harmonised and I am grateful to Janette Connolly and her team for adapting to this initiative.

Thank you for your support and efforts in contributing to another successful year.


Having their needs met opens up opportunities for new experiences leading to increased enjoyment and fun for children who might not otherwise have access to these experiences.



Diagnosed with a rare chromosome disorder and Cerebral Palsy, two year old Ben has a difficult time controlling his head and torso. Until Variety provided a Carrot Car Seat for Ben and his family, they were having a tough time getting him in and out of the car. Now, thanks to the swivel base on the car seat, Ben's carers can get him in and out of the car safely, making car trips and life a whole lot easier!







### REILLY

Global Developmental Delay effects 10 year old Reilly in many ways. He is non—verbal and easily overwhelmed, becoming extremely anxious and agitated in situations that other children his age would find inconsequential. Since Variety funded an Assistance Dog for Reilly, his family have seen a marked improvement. Reilly now sleeps through the night, with Jason the lab by his side. As Reilly gets older and starts school, Jason will give him the independence he needs to take part in activities with other children his age, minimising his need for constant individualised support.





### BRODIE

Cheeky young Brodie is completely dependent on his parents for all of his daily activities due to a number of physical and intellectual disabilities. When Variety provided Brodie with a modified trike, it enabled him to go on outings with his family. Brodie has recently started pedalling on his own, which his family were thrilled to see as it means mobility and independence are in reach for their son.



Tempy Primary is the "local" school for a number of small Mallee communities, most of whom are farmers or work in the farming industry. The tiny student population was just 19 for 2016.

Under resourced, the school has not had new readers for almost ten years.

That's why we were thrilled to pay a visit during the 2016 Variety Bash to present the school with a grant allowing them to purchase 50 brand new readers plus a reading comprehension kit that targets literacy in children from Prep to Grade 3.





As the only specialist facility in the area, Mildura Specialist School is a major resource for all local students with an intellectual disability between the ages of five and eighteen years old. Students are taught in small groups by teaching staff, and supported by teacher assistants. Looking to brighten their play, Variety Bash entrants visited Mildura Specialist School to present them with a Magic Carpet – an interactive floor projection system which is portable and can be programmed to meet a range of needs in the school environment. It responds to touch and movement, encouraging and helping to develop motor control (and it's a whole lot of fun!)











We couldn't do what we do without our faithful troop of volunteers who give up countless hours to help us in the office, on the road and at events. From the team at Variety Victoria, we send our most heartfelt thanks to each and every one of our volunteers for being so generous with their time to help Aussie kids be kids.







### 26 year old Renee is all about giving back while she is on the road to her own recovery!

After a car accident 7 years ago, Renee was left with both a bulging and compressed disc in her lower back. Regular physiotherapy, clinical pilates and personal training kept her pretty well until recently when the injury returned.

While waiting for an appointment with a neurosurgeon to see if surgery was necessary, Renee decided it was time to re-build her strength. Variety was the inspiration she needed to start her own fundraising challenge.

Only allowed very light exercise her plan was to start walking a set number of kilometres per day for the next 6 weeks- starting at 1km per day for the first week and increasing it by a kilometre each week. At the end of the 6 weeks Renee would be walking 6km each day – a huge accomplishment considering her back injury - to raise money for the Variety Freedom program.

Sharing her story and challenge online with family, friends and her very supportive workplace, Renee was thrilled to raise \$1280 for kids in need.



When keith Inr. decided to cut his beautiful flowing locks he thought to himself — why not try and raise some money at the same time.

After growing his hair for 4 years and a target of \$1000 to reach before making the chop, Keith put out his idea to family and friends.

So far Keith has raised \$2,210.56 with donations still coming through.
