On behalf of all our members and supporters, I'm proud to present the 2014 Annual Review for Variety – the Children's Charity of Western Australia.

The not for profit sector is in the midst of an exciting evolution, where effectiveness is judged not simply on fiscal performance, but on the depth of social impact felt through programs delivered.

It's a concept that's inherent to Variety WA.

When we give a child a modified bicycle, we're not just giving two wheels, we're giving freedom, independence and the gift of family time together, while also contributing to better physical health. When we award a scholarship to a child in need, the benefits go far beyond tuition, to stronger self-confidence and long term resilience. And when we grant an electric bed, it's more than just somewhere to sleep – it brings comfort and more peaceful rest, helping to prevent future injury to both parent and child.

In 2014, Variety is proud to have impacted the lives of more than 37,900 WA kids in need. This includes some 9,052 children directly assisted by Variety funded programs in 2014 worth more than \$1.52m*, as well as a nearly 28,900 children impacted in 2014 by ongoing Variety projects which were funded in previous years. These children, and the quality, relevance and timeliness of the support Variety WA provides, are the true measures of our success.

Variety WA remains committed to the best practice in transparency and corporate governance. Together, we raised more than \$1.88m net in 2013-2014**.

Of course, none of this would be possible without our outstanding Variety members, event participants, donors, sponsors and volunteers who give so generously and tirelessly each year. Thank you.

As I officially step down as Chief Barker, I would also like to take this opportunity to acknowledge my fellow Board members, our regional presidents and committees, sub-committee members and the staff of Variety WA for their efforts over the past twelve months.

Once again, thank you for everything you do to help Variety empower WA children who are sick, disadvantaged or have special needs to live, laugh and learn.

Since 1980, Variety – the Children’s Charity of Western Australia has been empowering WA children who are sick, disadvantaged or have special needs to live, laugh and learn.

By providing practical equipment, programs and experiences, Variety WA allows children to overcome the obstacles they face, and helps kids be kids.


We do this through three core programs:



In 2014, Variety committed approximately \$127,000 worth of much needed assistance each month to children right around the state.

All applications for support are considered by an independent Grants Committee made up of experienced members from the therapy, social service and education sectors, which investigates and prioritises need to ensure the best use of every fundraising dollar - with a particular focus on ‘filling the gaps’ for those who have nowhere else to turn.

The Variety Freedom Program gives the gift of freedom, mobility and independence to individual children living with special needs, through the provision of custom modified tricycles and bikes, wheelchairs, specialist car seats and more.

As part of the Freedom Program, Variety Sunshine Coaches allow children who are disadvantaged or have special needs to participate in school or community programs and activities, while Liberty Swings allow children otherwise confined to wheelchairs to enjoy the simple thrill of 'going for a swing'.

Lucas' Story

There is one passion that Lucas has in life and that is riding bikes. The spirited eleven year old loves to feel the wind in his face, but living with Down Syndrome meant it was incredibly difficult to operate a standard bicycle independently. That's when Variety joined forces with disability equipment designers TADWA to give Lucas his own set of wheels, custom made to provide all the balance, stability and safety he needed to hit the cycle ways!

"As a family we could never go out together because we never had a bike that was suitable for him. With the funding from Variety, we were able to purchase a bike with a rear steering handle that not only helps him physically, but also mentally," said Lucas' mum Penny. "He can now ride with the freedom of knowing that we are all equals. It has meant that we can enjoy the outdoors together as family and as parents our minds are at ease knowing we are able to control the bike."

Julian's Story

Established in 1996, the Variety Scholarships have been helping young people in need to explore their talents for over 18 years.

Emerging young artist Julian Poon, who lives with Autism, is one of many youth to have benefited from the program, receiving a scholarship each year since 2011.

"Julian has benefitted greatly from the scholarships as they have allowed him to buy better quality art materials such as canvases, paints and textas; pay for art tuition and much more," says Julian's mum, May.

His talent has developed so much so, that Julian has held two solo art exhibitions and a group exhibition at the prestigious Lawrence Wilson Art Gallery at the University of Western Australia. He has entered numerous art competitions and won the Mandorla Youth Art Award twice. To top it off, Julian was even commissioned by the City of Fremantle to do a wall mural on a heritage wall.

His star continues to rise, exhibiting art at a gallery in Melbourne and presenting at two conferences on the east coast.

Isabelle's Story

Eleven year old Isabelle can now enjoy a good night's sleep thanks to Variety WA.

Living with Cerebral Palsy, Isabelle uses an electric wheelchair for mobility, but has enough movement to make it a challenge for her to stay in bed safely.

To help overcome this, Variety was privileged to provide Isabelle with an electric adjustable bed. Now, Isabelle's nights are filled with sweet dreams and her Dad and step-Mum can rest easy knowing she's comfortable and safe.

"Isabelle was previously sleeping in a normal single bed with baby side rails which weren't strong enough, and there were times she pushed them off and fell out of bed. We then got an old hospital bed which was very heavy and not ideal as Isabelle often got her limbs stuck between the rails.

The new bed from Variety has rails that are high and strong enough so that Isabelle can't move them or get over them, and there are no gaps for her to get stuck. It also has the automatic controls which allow us to change her position if needed. She's sleeping better now than she has for some time".



Variety Motor Mouth Camp

Communicating when you can't speak can be a big challenge, but the annual Variety Motor Mouth Camp is helping to change all that for WA families.

Sixteen school aged children who use augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) aids, were given a huge helping hand when they attended the five day camp at Point Walter Reserve from 1-5 October. Over five days, 30 volunteers from various health professions provided their support, many taking annual leave from their work place to give their time and expertise.

With fun-filled daily activities to practice communication skills, a wide range of games and respite for siblings as well as dedicated parent information and training sessions, the Variety Motor Mouth Camp helps children and parents to become more confident using their communication devices and build friendships with families facing similar challenges.

Variety WA was thrilled to welcome iiNet as presenting sponsor in 2014, alongside the existing support from Lotterywest and our Variety donors.



Variety Toy Bank

The Variety Toy Bank program helps shine a light at a time when children and their mothers are emerging from the shadows of domestic violence.

The Variety Toy Bank program celebrated 20 years in 2014 and is based around the collection of new toys donated by guests who attend social events held by the committee during the year. In 2013-2014, over \$27,800 worth of toys were collected and shared with women's refuges across the state.

Each child arriving at a shelter is given a special toy to call their own – a precious gift after arriving traumatised and often with just the clothes on their back. Whilst it's a small token, the comfort such a gesture can bring these children is immeasurable.

In recent times, the Variety Toy Bank program has expanded its reach to provide much needed resources to the Protective Behaviours Safety Program. An education application for children who are victims of domestic violence has been developed and a number of iPads have been purchased to facilitate its use in WA refuges.

Variety acknowledges and thanks Mrs Tonya McCusker who stepped down as the Toy Bank patron in 2014, having made an outstanding commitment to the program over the last three years.



Variety Youth Choir

For more than 15 years, the Variety Youth Choir has been entertaining audiences whilst enriching the lives of its many talented young performers.

The choir helps increase the self-confidence and skills of its members, who have come together from a diverse range of backgrounds and abilities. A passion for song and dance unites the choir, who remain one of WA's busiest professional young performance groups.

Members volunteer their time, sharing their talent at performances throughout the year, and in turn acting as outstanding young ambassadors for Variety. They please crowds wherever they perform – whether it be for Variety or at other community and corporate events around the city.

To commemorate the Choir's recent 15th anniversary, a special concert was held at The Quarry Amphitheatre in March 2014. Almost 300 people enjoyed a spectacular evening of entertainment, featuring special guest performances from country music star Beccy Cole, Courtney Murphy and past and present Choir soloists.

The Variety Youth Choir is proudly sponsored by Killarnee.



Variety Scholarships

Every year, the Variety Scholarships are awarded to WA children in need with a gift for the arts, sport and education.

Thirty-nine young people received a scholarship at a special ceremony at the Heath Ledger Theatre in March, helping them to pursue and achieve their dreams.

Over \$105,000 worth of scholarships were presented, funding specialist tuition and related expenses. The scholarships help young people living with illness, disability or disadvantage to overcome adversity and explore their potential.

Awarded annually, over 240 scholarships have been presented since the program's inception in 1996.

In 2014, the Variety Scholarships were made possible thanks to generous support of Gloria Jean's Coffees, The Bendat Family Foundation, The Whately Foundation and Thrifty.





Goanna Adventure Camp

The Goanna Park Adventure Camp helps challenge teenagers living with physical or intellectual disability to increase their independence and self-confidence.

Twelve teenagers from across WA attended the camp, held in Darwin, in July. The week long camp is a unique experience run by the Variety Northern Territory office, with teens from all over Australia making the journey to the top end to take part.

Camp attendees experience a busy week of activities including abseiling, swimming, craft activities, camping and visiting local attractions.

For many campers, it's the first time they have been away from their parents or travelled interstate – making it a positive and often life changing experience. Most importantly, the camp allows the teenagers to develop friendships and express themselves in a safe and supportive environment.



Variety Kids Christmas Party

Each year, the Variety Kids Christmas Party puts smiles on the faces of hundreds of children and families.

In 2013, over 800 Variety children and siblings attended the annual event, held at the Claremont Showgrounds, accompanied by their parents and carers. The Christmas Party offers a welcome respite for families, giving them the opportunity to get in the festive spirit and enjoy a stress free afternoon together.

Kids are treated to inflatable playgrounds, specially designed wheelchair accessible go carts, bouncy castles, face painting, buggies, a maze and a present and visit from Santa Claus.

The 2013 Variety Kids Christmas Party was made possible thanks to a team of dedicated volunteers and sponsors, including the Stan Perron Charitable Trust, McCusker Charitable Foundation and Lotterywest, as well as supporting sponsors Neat Ideas, Refresh and many individual donors.

DECEMBER 2013

- More than 800 Variety children and their siblings, parents and carers enjoy a fun packed afternoon at the Variety Kids Christmas Party at Claremont Showground
- The IGA Carols by Candlelight sees the spirit of Christmas shine in an entertainment extravaganza at Supreme Court Gardens, raising more than \$17,000 for Variety WA

JANUARY 2014

- Variety WA teams up with the Perth Scorchers for a Variety Match Day at #TheFurnace with a Variety child tossing the coin pre match



FEBRUARY 2014

- "Il Gala Italiano" Variety WA Ball is held with over 600 guests attending and in excess of \$240,000 raised towards the Variety 4WD Challenge
- Over 20 boats take part in the Princess Variety Splash, travelling from Fremantle to Geographe Bay and raising over \$100,000



MARCH 2014

- Twenty four classic cars and their crews came together for the Variety Creative Car Cruise, proudly supported by 89's the Garage Door Specialists. Held for the fourth time, the event's popularity continues to grow, raising in excess of \$203,000
- One hundred keen golfers tee off at the Kalgoorlie Boulder Chamber of Commerce & Industry Charity Golf Day, raising over \$38,000 in support of Variety
- The Variety Mid West Ladies Luncheon helps nearly 140 youth at risk as a result of donated gift bags filled with much needed educational and personal products
- Thirty-nine talented young people are recognised with Variety Scholarships in a special presentation ceremony at Heath Ledger Theatre

APRIL 2014

- For the second year running the Variety of Chefs Ball, presented by Linneys, proves popular with Perth foodies when 400 guests pack the Grand Ballroom, Crown Perth and dig deep to help raise over \$180,000



JULY 2014

- The WA Marathon Club hold their popular ASICS Run for Gold, with a 10km and 5km run raising funds for Variety WA and Channel Nine's Appealathon
- The Variety Youth Choir welcomes new members in their mid-year auditions, continuing to entertain and inspire audiences with their high energy song and dance

MAY 2014

- Sixty adventurous four-wheel-drivers and officials make a 1,600km, nine day trip through the state's top end, raising just over \$409,000 on board the Variety 4WD Challenge, proudly supported by Coleman
- Students at St Hilda's Anglican School for girls participate in a special Lap-a-thon raising over \$28,000 for Variety WA.

AUGUST 2014

- The ultimate cross country adventure plays out during the 2014 Variety WA 'Trans Australia Bash', proudly supported by Gemmill Homes. Our WA contingent joins over 550 Bash cars and 1,750 counterparts from around the country as part of the National Bash event in Sydney before making the 5,000km journey home. The iconic fundraising event raises over \$820,000 in WA alone
- Diamantes, sequins and dancing are the themes at the annual Gemmill Homes Ball with a sold out crowd of 800 guests packing the Grand Ballroom, Crown Perth and raising \$130,000 for Variety WA
- Ninety participants enjoy a 'trip around the world' and raise over \$87,000 as part of the Variety Mid West 4WD Getaway

JUNE 2014

- Variety Toy Bank celebrates 20 years of brightening the lives of children affected by domestic violence, with a 190 head lunch at Rockpool



SEPTEMBER 2014

- A group of 30 road bikers travel some 230km and raise over \$51,000 for Variety as part of the Perth – Busselton Charity Bike Ride
