



Variety Motor Mouth Camp Guidelines & Eligibility document Volunteers

The Variety Motor Mouth Camp (MMC) was founded in 2011 and was created with the intention to assist children who have complex communication needs and use augmentative & alternative communication aids (AAC) to express themselves. The camp is an immersive experience, encouraging the user and their family to fully embrace their device and incorporate it into everyday life.

Every year a committee (MMCC) of volunteer therapists organise and run the camp alongside Variety staff. The camp is held in September/October and combines fun, development, and recreational activities for all involved, whilst fostering opportunities to build meaningful connections with other individuals in the AAC community.

For volunteers, this is a fantastic opportunity for some professional development if you work with children with complex communication needs, or can simply be a way for you to 'give back' to the community, assisting amazing children and their families.

Objectives

Eligibility

- Must have a current Working with Children Check
- Applicant must have experience working with children
- Applicant must be aged over 18 years of age
- Applicant must be able to work in small groups and assist children in a busy sensory environment
- Be able to attend majority of the camp (3 days not compulsory to stay overnight)
- Participate in all camp activities

Complete the online application form and submit by Sunday 2nd of June 2024.

- This is an alcohol & smoking free camp
- Meals & accommodation will be provided to volunteers
- All volunteers are expected to abide by their professional code of ethics and Variety's code of conduct
- Staying overnight at camp is not essential. Volunteers can opt to go home after evening activities are finished and return the next day by 8am
- There is no cost to volunteers or families to attend
- Camp is held at Point Walter campsite in Bicton, Perth
