Kids Support Department ThriveKids Individual Grant Eligibility & Guidelines Document



Variety ThriveKids Grants provide practical equipment to help WA kids develop and thrive. This includes items that promote behavioural regulation, physical development, independence, wellbeing, social inclusion and more.

Eligibility

To be eligible for this grant you are required to meet the following criteria:

- o Child is residing in WA.
- o Child is aged 0-17 (must be under 18 at time of submission).
- o Child has a disability or sickness (long-term health condition).
- The family household income is below the guide.
- The equipment is not available via government funding or alternative sources.

Application

- The application can be completed by a parent or carer, or approved third party (key therapist, social worker, support worker etc.) if they have consent of the parent or carer.
- You will be expected to submit a truthful and factual application and attach relevant documentation as evidence where requested.
- Income details are required (this includes any/all income received by any parent or carer who is financially responsible for the beneficiary to confirm annual household income).
 - Payslips (dated within 3 months).
 - Centrelink statements (dated within 3 months).
 - Most recent ATO notice of assessment (for self-employed).
- Provide two (2) quotes for equipment that are no older than three months at the time of submission and will remain valid throughout the assessment process.
 - One quote is acceptable if there is only one supplier that can source the equipment.

Supporting referee document

- Please nominate (and discuss with) the most appropriate professional (request dependent) to support the application as a referee.
- During the application process, there will be a section where you will be required to provide their information. Once this is done it will automatically prompt a template to be sent to them for completion.
- This form is mandatory, and applications will be incomplete until it is submitted. Applicants will be able to preview to ensure they are aware of content being requested.

Request & funding limits

You can select one or more items as part of Variety ThriveKids Grant request, as long as it is within the capped request limit. The items <u>must</u> be directly related to your child's diagnosis or condition, and the intended outcomes outlined in the supporting document.

Please note:

- If your income is over the suggested limit you may choose to apply, however you need to be able to demonstrate extraordinary hardship, expenses and/or circumstances.
- If the equipment required exceeds the request limit, you can request additional funds if there is clearly demonstrated need outlined within your application & supporting documents, however this does not guarantee additional funding.

Ineligible requests

- Equipment which is restrictive practice (may be waived if appropriately referenced by supporting professional with expertise in this area).
- o Therapy / companion animals.
- Individuals 18 years of age and older.
- Projects that require recurring funding.
- Expenses considered to be part of an individual's typical cost of living.
- Travel expenses including public transport and petrol.
- Warranties, insurance, maintenance, service agreements, batteries, repairs.
- Retrospective expenses.
- Incomplete application forms (no supporting documents).
- Services or therapies.

Process

Step 1 – complete and submit the online application form including all supporting documentation.

Step 2 – pre-assessment done by the Kids Support team.

Step 3 – submission reviewed by the Kids Support Committee (a group of qualified professionals representing the allied health, community, and education sectors).

Step 4 - outcome letter emailed to main contact listed in application (Outcomes are typically communicated within 6-12 weeks of submission).

Outcomes

Successful Applicants

If successful, full details and next step instructions will be provided to you in your outcome letter

- Funds need to be used within 6 months of approval date (extensions may be given for vehicle related requests only)
- Variety WA does not provide funds directly to the you, payment is made via tax invoice to the supplier
- You will not be able to apply for another Variety grant for a period of 12-36 months depending on the category, this will be outlined in approval letter.

Unsuccessful Applicants

- Reasons for an unsuccessful application will not be disclosed, the decision of the committee is absolute.
- If unsuccessful, you may be eligible to reapply after 3 months from the date listed on outcome letter, however the request must be altered, or new information supplied.
